

How to make a complaint

If you want to make a complaint about Fife Women's Aid Counselling Service, then it will go through the Fife Women's Aid Complaints Policy. If this doesn't resolve the issue, then you can submit a complaint to the Confederation of Scottish Counselling Agencies (COSCA).

What is counselling?

Counselling with a skilled therapist can help you to talk and work through difficult feelings and experiences.

Counselling and domestic abuse

If you have experienced or been affected by domestic abuse, we have a counselling service to support you. Abuse can mean anything from physical violence to being controlled, forced or manipulated emotionally, financially, sexually, psychologically or socially.

Domestic abuse can affect people in all sorts of ways so each counselling session will be unique.

Where and when can I get counselling?

We have a small team of experienced counsellors working all over Fife. We will try to organise an appointment at a time and place that suits you.

Appointments usually last for 50 minutes. You and your counsellor can decide after your first one if this is the right service for you.

Is counselling confidential?

Anything you discuss with the counsellor will remain confidential, unless we are concerned about child or adult safety or about criminal conduct. If this is the case, we have a legal duty to pass these concerns onto the relevant agencies.

Your counsellor will discuss confidentiality with you in more detail during your first appointment.
