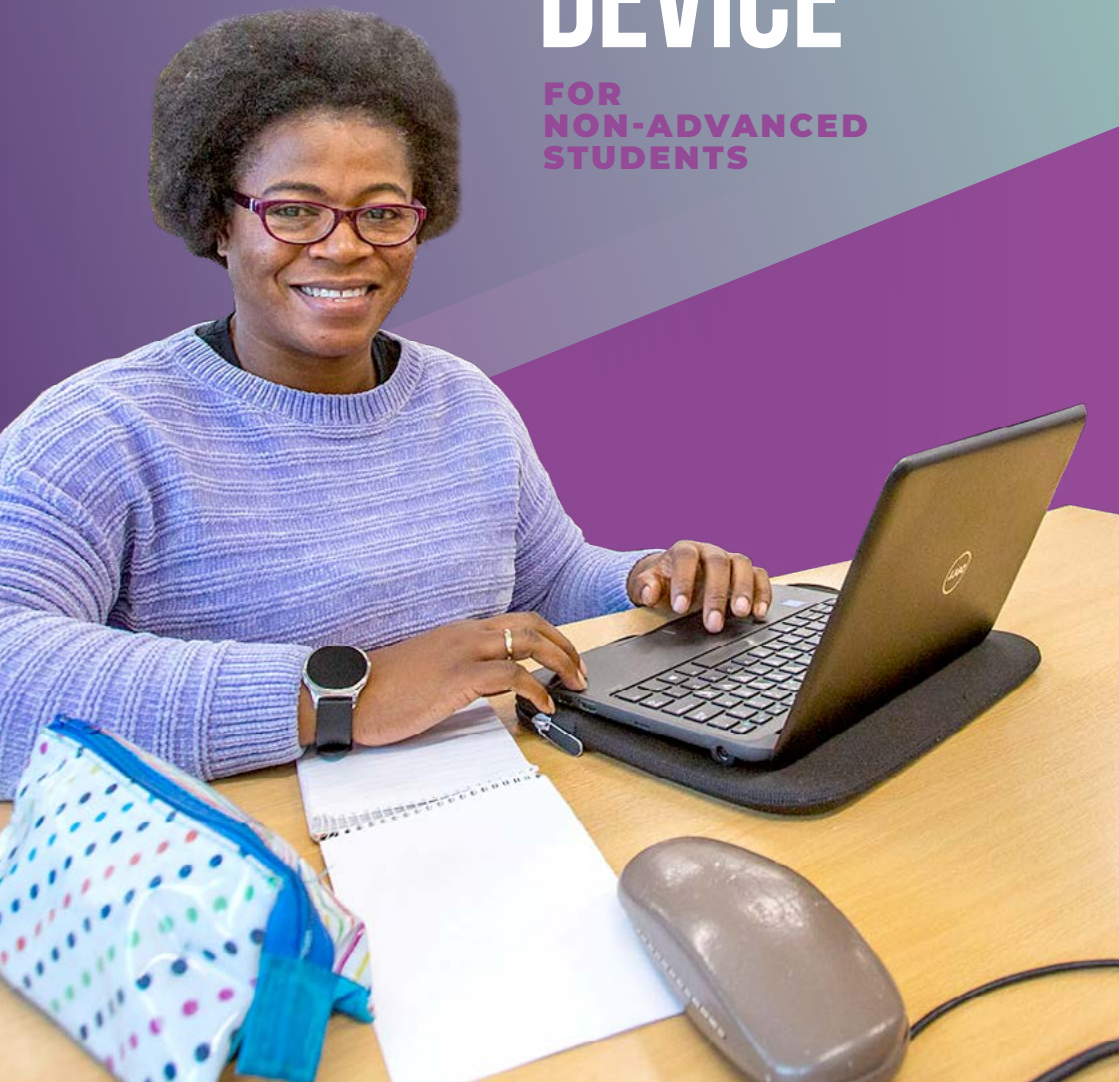

BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE (BYOD) PROGRAMME

Thank you for choosing to study at North East Scotland College. The new academic term is just around the corner and I am sure that by now, you are beginning to get excited about the prospect of commencing or continuing your studies at the College.

The course that you have applied for is a Bring Your Own Device, or BYOD, programme. This means that you are required to have access to your own laptop or netbook computer in class each day.

To enable this, when you apply for Bursary funding you have the option of being provided with your very own laptop at Induction that will be yours to keep throughout your time at College.

Please be aware that depending on your bursary status, you may be required to contribute to the cost of this device – please see the “Device Information” section for further details.

Having access to your own personal device will enable you to access appropriate materials during classes (using our wireless network) and will also allow you to undertake effective self-study both in the College, and at home.

DEVICE INFORMATION

Please note, no devices are “free of charge” they are either funded via your bursary or funded directly by yourself.

It is important that you have a device ready for the beginning of term so please ensure that your bursary application and any necessary supporting evidence is submitted as soon as possible following your offer of a place at College. Applications for funding will open in April, and can take around 4-6 weeks to assess. **For courses starting in August, no devices will be**

also provide you with unlimited access to Blackboard, the College’s virtual learning environment. Blackboard provides a host of useful information and makes it possible to access learning materials and tools on most internet enabled devices from any location.

Blackboard contains all the vital information about your course and allows you to communicate with lecturers and other students. You can access Blackboard even when you are not in College so you can easily catch-up or revise materials covered in class.

Through Blackboard you will be able to access interactive materials, stream videos and podcasts, and access other resources such as:

- Course announcements
- Course handbooks
- Lecture notes and handouts
- PowerPoint presentations
- Tests and quizzes
- Virtual classrooms such as Blackboard Collaborate Ultra
- Online resources
- Blogs & Wikis

issued after the 31st of October, so it is vital that you ensure your bursary application is submitted well in advance of this deadline.

You will be asked to complete a questionnaire to let us know if you require help with a device, connection with the internet, or support to improve your digital skills

The sooner you complete your questionnaire and bursary application the sooner you will know whether you are entitled to a college bursary and therefore whether you will have to contribute to the cost of a college laptop.

The cost of the device offered to you at Induction, if you require it **may be** funded via the “course materials” element of the non-advanced bursary. This means that if you are under the age of 18 on the start date of the course, we are able to supply you with a device so long as you have completed your bursary application prior to the closing date, and have been assessed to receive funding for the laptop, you will **not be** required to contribute to the cost of purchasing the device.

If however you are over the age of 18 at enrolment and entitled to a bursary, you will be subject to means testing which means that you may be required to contribute to the cost of the device. The amount you may need to contribute may vary from the full cost of the device (approximately £300), down to no contribution at all.

Should you only receive a partial bursary you will be asked to contribute to the cost of the device and arrangements for payment of the contribution must be in place before the device is issued.

If you have completed the questionnaire, submitted your bursary application, but have not received a final acceptance, you will still be able to collect a loan college device if you need it.

If you are not eligible to apply for a bursary you will be required to supply your own device. If you are not eligible for funding but require a device you may be able to collect a loan device instead. There will be a stock of short-term loan devices available that you will be able to borrow on a short-term basis should you experience a problem with your own device.

Most Non-Advanced courses have core IT unit, such as ECDL or PC Passport, as part of their programme of study. As a result, a Tablet, e.g. an iPad, Chromebook, mobile phone is not an acceptable device for a BYOD course since you cannot install the Office software on a Chromebook or a tablet/smartphone..

RETURNING STUDENTS

If you were enrolled on a Non-Advanced BYOD course at NESCol during academic year 2019-2020, 2020-2021 and have already been issued with a BYOD laptop, please be aware that you will be required to use this device again when you return to College in August 2021.

You will not be issued with another device if you received one the previous year. Anyone who does take a second device will receive an invoice for the full cost of the laptop.

ALTERNATIVE DEVICES

If you are not entitled to funding and decide to purchase your own device please bear in mind that is not necessary for you to purchase a high-end device for the purposes of BYOD. A minimum device specification can be found towards the end of this document and suitable machines can be purchased from approximately £250 at most major retailers.

Once enrolled at College you will have access to a Microsoft Office 365 account. Not only does this give you access to your College email account but it also provides you with ITB of cloud storage and access to the full suite of Office applications including Word, Excel, PowerPoint and MS Teams for the duration of your course. This means that you do not need to purchase this software if you do not already have it or purchase a device with a larger hard drive, enabling you to purchase a cheaper device if you wish.

You may already own or have access to a laptop or similar device, however if you need to purchase a device before the start of your course a suggested specification is outlined below:

The following Notebook/Laptop specification is recommended as a minimum:

NOTEBOOK / LAPTOP SPECIFICATION

Operating System: Windows 10

Processor: Absolute minimum – 1.6 (GHz) equivalent or faster

Memory: Minimum - 2GB RAM

Storage: Minimum - 64GB (free 1Tb Office 365 OneDrive cloud storage is available to all students)

Display: Minimum 11" screen (1280 x 768)

Wireless: Networking - 802.11b/g/n (1x1)

Connectivity: USB / Bluetooth

Additional: Camera / Microphone

Battery Life: 5+ hours

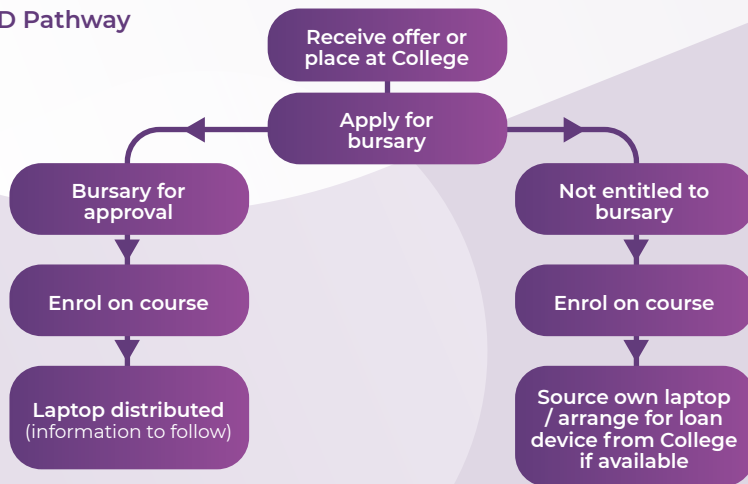
Tablets, Chromebooks and mobile phones are not acceptable BYOD devices for Non-Advanced programmes.

When you arrive at College a full induction will take place that will include issuing you with a device, the use of your computer, connection to the wireless network, access to and use of College resources and systems.

In addition you will also be introduced to the excellent IT support services that you will be provided with whilst studying at College.
