
9. A diverse student body



Complete your application

Find the course you want to apply for on our website and click/tap on either Online Applications or Paper Applications. If you apply online, we will send you an email to say we've received your application* (please check your junk folder). If you apply using a paper application, we will write to you to confirm that it arrived safely*.

**If you have not heard within 10 working days, please contact the Student Advice Centre.*

stage 2

Book an interview

We aim to contact you within six weeks of receiving your application form. When we process your application, we may invite you for an information session/interview. You will receive a letter or email giving information on how to book an interview date. It is really important that you book your interview date and time as soon as you can. If we don't hear from you, your application may be withdrawn.

**Some courses may also require an audition, skills test, or portfolio. Details on what to expect at your information session/interview will be provided in your confirmation email once you book your interview slot online, or in your letter if you have applied using a paper application form. The health, safety and wellbeing of our students is a priority and the 2022 process will take into account the latest Scottish Government guidance. Interviews are likely to be conducted online or by telephone.*

University

Degree Link is the unique partnership between North East Scotland College and Robert Gordon University, which can allow students to enter into year three of a degree from HND level. As the first College in Scotland to be an associate of a university, NESCol has worked closely with RGU to offer students seamless progression from one course to another.

Degree Link is mostly offered on a 2+2 basis – two years at College followed by two years at university, but in some cases where a course is only offered at HNC level, students can progress directly into second year at RGU.

Terms and conditions: In order to articulate, you must be on a specified HNC/HND route and have successfully completed your course. You may have to fulfil certain knowledge requirements or selection criteria. For instance, depending on the individual course requirements, students may be asked to complete particular modules while at College, go through the interview process or submit a portfolio of work.

To find out more about the specific degree course entry requirements, students should speak to their Academic Tutor or their Curriculum Manager, but in the meantime, take a look at the pathways available and start thinking Higher!

Other University Links

North East Scotland College also has formal articulation links with the University of Aberdeen and many universities around Scotland, as well as the Open University. All of our final year HND courses progress into at least one degree with many having several options. Formal links exist with:

What does this mean?

In the majority of cases, students who successfully complete their HND (two years) can go straight into year three of a degree programme with no wasted time! However, universities often apply conditions for entry, depending on the course. For example, you may need to achieve a particular grade in certain units, or in the case of music and drama, you may have to pass an audition. You will have to apply through UCAS before the January deadline, but NESCol will provide support for this. To find out more about specific articulation entry requirements, applicants should contact the university.

Alternatively, students can speak to their Academic Tutor or their Curriculum Manager at College.



Blackboard

Blackboard is the College's Virtual Learning Environment. All students will have access to a course area within Blackboard. You'll find course material, resources and spaces to chat with your classmates and lecturers. Blackboard also has a tool called Collaborate Ultra, which allows lectures to be delivered and attended online. The Blackboard app is available so you can view content and receive announcements from your smartphone.



As a student at NESCol you will have free access to Microsoft Office 365, which includes the use of key Office applications like Word, Excel and PowerPoint. You'll be able to access your College email account (Outlook) and use important online communication tools like Teams & Skype. Office 365 also gives you access to OneDrive – which offers 1TB of cloud data storage for all your College work – no need for a pen drive! Mobile apps are also available for Office 365 to keep up to date on the move.

learning resources



You can find Library Plus sites at Aberdeen City, Aberdeen Altens and Fraserburgh Campuses. Each Library stocks a slightly different range of materials to reflect the range of courses offered at that campus. In addition to subject specific books, journals and multimedia tools, each library also provides access to a wide range of other services, and a huge number of online learning resources to enhance your learning experience.



Located within each Library Plus facility you will find a Digital Skills Space, featuring Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) workspaces and dedicated desktop PC work areas. These spaces are also used to deliver core IT teaching, drop-in IT support and scheduled digital skills workshops. You can also use these spaces for flexible access to PCs during Library Plus opening hours.



NESCol believes that your learning and teaching experience at College can be enhanced significantly by use of a mobile device, such as a tablet or a laptop. For this reason, many students are required to bring a device with them to College. This initiative is known as Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) and its aim is to provide learners with a more bespoke and student-centred learning experience. Funding may be available.

How to apply for a full-time course

You can apply for a course with us at the same time as applying to other colleges or universities, and all you have to do is submit a completed application form – online or on paper. As soon as applications open in November, right through until the beginning of the new academic year in August. We recommend applying as soon as possible as many courses fill up quickly.

If you apply online you will receive an acknowledgement straight away. If you don't receive an email then please ensure to check your junk mail box just in case, or contact the Student Advice Centre.

Paper Applications

If you wish to apply using a paper application, simply complete all of the required information and return your application to the College using the address noted on the form. You will receive a letter acknowledging your application. If you have not heard within 10 working days please contact the Student Advice Centre. If for some reason we are unable to process your course booking, we will contact you directly.
