



THE KITCHEN



BYOD | BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE

If you have enrolled on a BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) course you are required to have access to your own laptop in class each day.

Depending on your bursary award, some non-advanced (any course that's not HNC or HND) level students have the option of being provided with a laptop that is funded or part-funded by NESCol.

Students who are enrolled on a non-BYOD course but who require a device can apply for a loan laptop which they will return to college at the end of the academic year. Any student who requires a loan laptop should contact the College Administration team at centraladmin@nescol.ac.uk for an application form.

Advanced Students (those studying an HNC or HND) are not eligible for College Bursary support and therefore must use their SAAS funding to obtain a device.

Information on collecting your device will be issued via email so please check your inbox and junk mail regularly.





Office 365

As a student at NESCol you will have on-demand access to Microsoft Office 365.

BLACKBOARD

Access your materials from anywhere, at anytime.

Blackboard is the Virtual Learning Environment system used in the College. It will be the main platform that lecturers will use to make resources available to you, including interactive materials, videos, live lectures, assessments and feedback.

You can find information about your courses, including announcements, handouts and lecture notes, tests and guizzes, online assignment submissions, discussion boards, and blogs.

You will be expected to check on Blackboard on a daily basis and you can access it from a variety of devices.

ADDITIONAL SUPPORT FOR LEARNING

Our Student Advice and Support team, located within the Student Advice Centre, also offers a wide range of support to students who have additional learning or support requirements, including:

Physical or sensory impairments

Specific learning difficulties e.g. dyslexia, autistic spectrum condition

Physical/medical/mental health conditions

Support for student carers, estranged students and care experienced students

If this applies to you then you may already have met with the team for a support needs assessment. If not, please contact the team in the Student Advice Centre using the details on page 12.

The support needs assessment is a two-way review process with you and the team. Staff are highly skilled at putting people at ease and asking appropriate questions sensitively and professionally.

The support needs assessment process identifies where additional support may be required and reasonable adjustments made in the learning environment that will assist you when studying at the College.

Many students do not require any support beyond that which is provided within the classroom, but the Student Advice and Support Team also offers one-to-one or group support to students for key skills such as:

Communication

Research

Numeracy

Proof reading

ΙT

Presentation skills

Report writing

Revision techniques

ACADEMIC TUTOR

All full-time students will be allocated an Academic Tutor.

Your Academic Tutor will be your main point of contact for academic, welfare, wellbeing and support and you will have dedicated time with them each week.

Where appropriate they will refer you to specialist support services such as the Student Advice and Support Team and Student Funding Team.

They will have individual meetings with you to discuss your attendance, progress and achievement. They will make sure there is time for you to:

Access progression information

Participate in NESCol initiatives and events

Give and receive feedback through Course Committee Meetings and your Class Rep



ITHELPZONE

The IT HelpZone is run by computing students for students.

The team can help with passwords, give advice on IT related issues, PAT Test your devices (which must be done before you can use them at College), and troubleshoot technical issues. In response to the Scottish Government's commitment on menstrual dignity, NESCol has free sanitary products available at all our campuses.

These are provided free of charge in all of our campus toilet facilities and there are also bags for you to take a supply home. If you would like to order products on a regular basis please complete this form.





Funding for Further Education Courses Non-advanced courses (any course that is not an HNC/HND)

A bursary is made up of a number of allowances, and is awarded based on your circumstances at the start of the course. You must apply to the College to see if you are eligible to receive a bursary.

The common elements are:

Fee Waiver Award

This is an award to cover the cost of course fees.

Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) A weekly allowance to cover general living costs while attending College. This funding is only available to students who are under 18 at the start of the course and does depend on the level of parent's income.

Course Materials Allowance

This is a sum of money (paid in one instalment) to the student or directly to the Curriculum for the cost of essential course materials

Maintenance Allowance

This is an allowance to cover daily living costs.

Travel Allowance

This allowance is to pay for travel costs to attend College, if a student lives more than two miles from a Campus.

Care Experienced Maintenance Allowance This allowance can be paid to Care Experienced students who have been in the care of the Local Authority.

Universal Credit Maintenance AllowanceThis can be paid to students who are entitled to receive Universal Credit while attending college.

Students who are under 18 at the start of the course can apply for a travel or materials award. This award is not means tested on parents/guardians income. Under 18's may also be eligible for an EMA award, this is means tested on the parents/guardians income Students who are over 18 at the start date of the course may be eligible for a Bursary award. Bursary awards are meanstested on the income of the student, and that of the household, whether that be parents/guardians or spouse/partner.

Funding for Higher Education Courses

Advanced courses (HNC/HND)

In order to receive funding for any HNC/HND course at NESCol you must apply to SAAS. You should apply to SAAS for your course fees, otherwise the College will invoice you for the cost of the course. The current course fees are £1,285.00. If you are a Young Student or an Independent Student, you are able to apply for a bursary and a student loan.

Other available financial support for students

We can help students who are in financial hardship and help with living costs such as rent. We are also able to help students who need to pay for childcare whilst they are at College. Both of these funds are means tested and subject to eligibility checks.


