

PATHWAYS TO UNIVERSITY



ACHIEVEMENTS AT NESCOL OPEN UP A RANGE OF OPTIONS WHEN IT IS TIME TO TAKE THAT IMPORTANT NEXT STEP.

The College can provide a direct route to university and hundreds of our students make the transition to degree courses each year.

Articulation arrangements with RGU, the University of Aberdeen and universities across Scotland mean students can progress to year two or year three of university on successful completion of an HNC or HND.

According to the latest study, more than 55% of students leaving Scottish colleges with a qualification at SCQF Level 7 or above went on to study at university.

NESCol works closely with partner universities to offer well established pathways and align courses to provide a smooth transition – with more than 50 links from NESCol to RGU alone!

DEGREElink

NESCOL has partnered with RGU to make the transition from college to university as straightforward as possible.

The collaboration allows students to take their first steps towards a degree by studying in the vibrant and nurturing NESCol environment, with the aim of progressing to university when the time is right.

The Degree Link programme is the perfect platform for students who aim to study at university after building qualifications, knowledge and skills at College.

Entry will be subject to specified routes through HNC/HND or certain knowledge requirements. Completion of a HNC will lead to entry in year two of a degree course and completion of a HND will lead to entry in year three of a degree course.

In some cases there may be course-specific requirements, such as taking specified options on an HN programme, and some courses may require presentation of a portfolio or an interview with an RGU tutor.

As a NESCol student you can join the RGU Associate Student scheme, bringing a number of benefits.

INTRODUCTION TO ART & DESIGN SCQF LEVEL 5

Course code: PAMAC (City) RHMPR (Fraserburgh)

You will investigate the world of art and design in this practical, hands-on course that will allow you to discover and advance your talents using a range of techniques. Not only will you develop the creative skills needed to advance in your studies but also improve a number of transferable skills for life and work.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Passes at National 4 level or equivalent. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

ART & DESIGN PORTFOLIO BUILDING SCOF LEVEL 6

Course code: PAMAD (City) RHMAD (Fraserburgh)

You will develop skills in art and design and prepare a portfolio to showcase your skills and techniques. You will develop creative art or design solutions, informed by an understanding and awareness of contemporary practices and issues.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Four passes at National 5 level or equivalent to include Art & Design and English/Communication.
Alternatively, applicants may have completed an appropriate Level 5 course.

HNC/HND ART & DESIGN SCOF LEVEL 7/8

Course code: HNC - RHCD (Fraserburgh) / HND - RHDD (Fraserburgh)

You will have opportunities to refine a broad range of art and design skills in 2D and 3D areas, with a thorough grounding in research, analysis and concept development using a range of media and techniques. You will also develop an awareness of the historical, contextual and social issues relevant to art and design practice.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants should have a minimum of one course pass at Higher level or equivalent in Art & Design. A pass in English/Communication at National 5 or equivalent is also required. Alternatively, applicants may have completed an appropriate Level 6 course. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

HND CONTEMPORARY ART PRACTICE SCOF LEVEL 7/8

Course code: PADC (City)

This course provides a broad visual education in Contemporary Art Practice to develop skills, knowledge and an awareness of specialist art and design disciplines. You will have the opportunity to develop individual practice in relation to personal interests. This will be enhanced by historical and contextual studies, so that you can explore the work of professional artists to link to your individual practice. You will be able to work individually and in teams supported by group discussion, personal and individual support. This could link to client projects and public art experiences and exhibitions.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Progress from Art & Design Level 6 college course. Alternatively, a minimum of one Higher pass and a portfolio review (information on portfolio requirements will be sent after you apply). A portfolio of work from work/practice may also be accepted.

FASHION & TEXTILES: DESIGN & MANUFACTURE SCOF LEVEL 6

Course code: PAMFT (City)

This course gives you the opportunity to explore your creative side, developing an understanding of and basic skills in the areas of fashion design and garment manufacture. You will build a portfolio of work to advance to HND Textiles or HNC Fashion Business. Each year culminates in a fashion show.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Four passes at National 5 level or equivalent to include Art & Design and English/Communication or an appropriate Level 5 course. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

HND TEXTILES SCOF LEVEL 8

Course code: PADS (City)

Students will learn to design and produce fashion garments using a range of different materials and techniques, whilst working in a creative environment which closely replicates industry standards. The topics covered will allow you to develop strong original concepts based on your study of design semantics, surface decoration for textiles, professional design practice and observational drawing. The course also includes a creative project for artists and designers, where you can explore your individuality in textile techniques. Each year culminates in a fashion show.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two Highers, one of which should be Art & Design. A pass in English/Communication at National 5 or equivalent is also required or an appropriate Level 6 course. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry. Advanced entry directly to year 2 is possible for those who have completed 15 credits from HNC Textiles.

FASHION BUSINESS SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: PAMFU (City)

If you wish to work in the business of fashion retail, this course will give you the starting point to explore the diverse skills and employment in this competitive industry. From introductory projects in fashion business management, buying, merchandising, range planning, and forecasting for the latest trends and styles, You will learn about the different roles in this industry to help you make career decisions.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

At least four course passes at National 5, or prior life/industry experience.

HNC FASHION BUSINESS SCQF LEVEL 7

Course code: PACF (City)

This course will prepare you for the diverse careers available in the competitive fashion retailing industry. As well as developing creative strategies in fashion, you will also learn how to apply key business standards for enterprise in this industry.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

One Higher (minimum) or equivalent or an appropriate Level 6 course. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may apply.

PHOTOGRAPHY PORTFOLIO BUILDING SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: PCMPG (City)

If you would like to develop a portfolio by exploring diverse essential photographic approaches and skills required for progression to more advanced levels of study in photography, or prepare yourself for initial entry to employment within the photoimaging sector, then this is the course for you!

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Four passes at National 5 level or equivalent, preferably including Art & Design and English/
Communication. Alternatively, applicants may have completed an appropriate Level 5 course. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

HND PHOTOGRAPHY SCOF LEVEL 8

Course code: PCDP (City)

This advanced course will give you the chance to undertake diverse, advanced photography projects using industry-standard equipment and technology. You will be able to make decisions as you progress about how you will apply these skills for industry, whether this is in a commercial or creative arts vocation. You will also have the opportunity to visit professional studios in London and also visit Paris for the largest photographic fair in Europe.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two Highers to include Art & Design, English or Photography or an appropriate Level 6 course. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry. Advanced entry directly to year 2 with 15 credits from HNC Photography.

FILMCRAFT & ANIMATION BROADLY COMPARABLE TO SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: PBMFT (City)

On this course, you will develop flexible, wide-ranging skills appropriate to the film and animation industries, which will enable you to progress to a variety of advanced courses in related areas. Learners will have access to a range of high-quality resources to support their learning e.g. cameras, editing equipment, and animation software.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants should have a minimum of three course passes at National 5 level or equivalent. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

HND 3D COMPUTER ANIMATION SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: PBDE (City)

The HND 3D Computer Animation course will provide you with the technical and creative skills needed for a career in the animation industry. Students will explore a range of topics such as character design and modelling, environmental modelling, special effects, compositing and motion graphics. Using industry-standard software and equipment, students will learn the technical process of animation – from design, storyboarding, modeling and animating, through to the final editing process. Students will have an opportunity to learn 3Ds Max, After Effects, Photoshop, traditional drawing, character design, storyboarding, animation principles and techniques to create a wide range of animation.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two Highers or equivalent or an appropriate Level 6 course. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry. Advanced entry directly to year 2 with 15 credits from HNC 3D Computer Animation.

DEVELOP A PORTFOLIO IN VISUAL COMMUNICATION SCOF LEVEL 6

Course code: PAMVC (City)

This course has been designed for those with an interest in developing skills that are relevant for the creative design sector. This project-based course is ideal for those who wish to pursue a career in computer arts or graphic design – an exciting and rapidly expanding area of the creative industries.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Four passes at National 5 level or equivalent to including Art and English/Communication or an appropriate Level 5 course. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

HND VISUAL COMMUNICATION (GRAPHIC DESIGN AND/OR ILLUSTRATION) SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: PADA (City)

This course will prepare you for Visual Communication roles that require creativity, conceptual thinking, critical analysis, and planning and reflection skills. You will experience industry-standard approaches and technology to develop solutions to client commissions for a diverse range of promotion, advertising, packaging and illustration by visually communicating ideas for client purposes. You will build a portfolio of work to make decisions for progression to university or employment.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two Highers or equivalent preferably including Art & Design, English, Graphic Communication or Product Design. Or an appropriate Level 6 course. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry. Advanced entry directly to year two with 15 credits from HNC Visual Communication.

FLORISTRY BROADLY COMPARABLE TO SCOF LEVEL 5

Course code: RHGF (Fraserburgh)

This course acts as excellent preparation for pursuing a career in a modern floristry business, and will equip successful learners with the essential theoretical understanding and practical skills required to style and create a range of traditional and contemporary floral designs.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Passes at National 4 level or equivalent. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

DIPLOMA IN AUTOMOTIVE VEHICLE ACCIDENT REPAIR LEVEL 1 BROADLY COMPARABLE TO SCQF LEVEL 4

Course code: QQQD (Altens)

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

INTRODUCTION TO BUSINESS & ADMINISTRATION

SCQF LEVEL 4/5

Course code: PGMT (City) RHMT (Fraserburgh)

This course will introduce you to various business and administration subjects ensuring you have a rounded knowledge of these. You will develop skills in IT, administration, accounting and customer care

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Passes at National 4 or equivalent. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

BUSINESS, ACCOUNTING & ADMINISTRATION

SCQF LEVEL 5/6

Course code: PGMBM (City) RHMBM (Fraserburgh)

This course is intended to provide learners with a broad knowledge of key business functions alongside an associated range of practical skills in areas such as IT, administration, finance, law in the workplace, marketing and customer care. The course is designed to give students progression pathways to HND study in Accounting, Administration and IT, Business and in Legal Services; and to gain skills and knowledge for progression into employment. The course includes a lot of practical elements, allowing students to apply and demonstrate the skills, knowledge and experience gained.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants should ideally have three National 5, Standard Grade Credit or Intermediate 2 qualifications, preferably including English and Maths. Other qualifications and experience may be considered, but the ability to work at SCQF Level 5 is essential.

HND BUSINESS SCOF LEVEL 8

Course code: PGDB (City) RHCB (Fraserburgh - Year 1 only)

This advanced level course will further enhance your understanding of key business functions and provide you with an invaluable, detailed overview of the business world. You will acquire a wide range of transferable skills, highly sought after by employers, ensuring you are well-equipped for progression towards further study or direct entry into employment.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two Highers at Grade C or above, preferably in Business and English and a National 5 qualification in Accounting or Maths or Applications of Maths. Or successful completion of SCQF Level 5/6 Business, Accounting & Administration at NESCol. Or a Foundation Apprenticeship in Accounting or Business Skills. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may be considered.

HND LEGAL SERVICES (LAW) SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: PGDL (City)

This advanced level course will help successful candidates to pursue employment in a legal office or as a paralegal or legal secretary. Alternatively, successful completion will allow you to progress to further legal study at university degree level. It is an excellent foundation course that will give you a good understanding of legal practices and procedures, various aspects of law and how the legal system works.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

At least two Higher qualifications, at Grade C or above, preferably in English and one other subject. Or successful completion of SCQF Level 5/6 Business, Accounting and Administration at NESCol. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

HND ACCOUNTING SCOF LEVEL 8

Course code: PGDA (City) RHCN (Fraserburgh)

This course is perfect for those looking to enter the accounting profession. The course will help you to build a well-rounded, valuable skill set that meets the standards required by employers. The course is designed to provide you with a solid foundation in the concepts and processes used in financial and management accounting as well as other essential and academic skills required in the professional workplace.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

At least two Highers at Grade C or above, preferably in English and one other subject, and Maths/
Applications of Maths at National 5.
Or successful completion of SCQF
Level 5/6 Business, Accounting and Administration at NESCol.
Foundation Apprenticeships in Accounting or Business can also be considered among the entry requirements for this course. Visit the course page on our website to find out more. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

HND ADMINISTRATION & INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: PGDD (City)

This advanced level course will build on your existing knowledge, and ensure that you are well-equipped to move on to a university degree or employment. By the end of the course you will be able to demonstrate the skills needed to effectively manage and make important decisions in an administration work environment.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

One Higher at Grade C or above, preferably in Administration, Business or English. Or successful completion of SCQF Level 5/6 Business, Administration and Marketing at NESCol. Foundation Apprenticeships in a range of subjects can also be considered among the entry requirements for this course. Visit the course page on our website to find out more. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

OUR COURSES

INTRODUCTION TO HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE SCOF LEVEL 4

Course code: PTMHR (City) RJMHR (Fraserburgh)

This course will introduce you to the different areas and different people who use the services available in the health and social care sector. It provides an important opportunity for students to develop soft skills and interpersonal skills within a care context. The course explores how critical it is to provide effective and efficient provision of care.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Three National 4 or Standard Grade at Foundation Level or Intermediate 1 qualifications, preferably including English. Other qualifications and experience may be considered, but the ability to work at SCQF Level 4 is essential. A genuine aptitude for working with people and good communication skills are very important.

HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE SCOF LEVEL 5

Course code: RJMHC (Fraserburgh)

This course will provide students with a firm understanding of the expectations and values involved in health and social care roles. The course introduces a variety of care professions across statutory, voluntary and private settings. This will enable a better understanding of complexities of delivering effective care to a variety of service users. Applicants should enjoy diverse group interaction and be mature enough to work on their own initiative. We look for individuals who are enthusiastic with a positive attitude to learning and can show commitment to this year-long course.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum of two National 5, Standard Grade Credit or Intermediate 2 qualifications at Grade C or above, preferably including English. Alternatively, applicants should have successfully completed a relevant course at SCQF Level 4. Other qualifications and experience may be considered, but the ability to work at SCQF Level 5 is essential as well as a genuine aptitude for working with people and good communication skills.

ADVANCED HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE SCOF LEVEL 6

Course code: RJMCT (Fraserburgh)

This course will increase your understanding of a variety of health and care contexts and service users, effectively preparing you for further study or employment. You will also investigate care intervention and the roles and responsibilities across associated professions.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

One Higher at Grade C or above, in addition to three National 5, Intermediate 2 (Grade B or above) or

Standard Grade Credit level qualifications, preferably to include English and Biology or another relevant subject. Or, any relevant SCQF Level 5 course. A genuine interest in working with people and good communication skills are essential.

HEALTHCARE SCOF LEVEL 5

Course code: PTMLN (City)

The Healthcare route provides students with a firm understanding of the expectations and values involved in care roles but has a slight bias towards subjects that lead towards nursing. You will be introduced to a variety of care professions across statutory, voluntary and private settings, and the course will enable you to better understand the complexities of delivering effective care to a variety of service users

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two National 5 passes at Grade C or above, preferably including English, or two Standard Grades at General Level or equivalent. Alternatively, applicants should have successfully completed a relevant course at SCQF Level 4. Other qualifications and experience may be considered but the ability to work at SCQF Level 5 is essential. A genuine aptitude for working with people and good communication skills are also essential.

ADVANCED HEALTHCARE SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: PTMHN (City)

This course is ideal for thoughtful and considerate individuals who may be interested in becoming an adult, mental health or children and Young Person Nurse or Paramedic and who care about supporting those who need help with daily living activities. Those who wish to pursue a career in midwifery or paramedic practice will require additional Higher level qualifications, please check with admissions at your preferred university for entry requirements. Enthusiastic school leavers or those who would like a career change and who may have had experience of caring for others should apply. You should enjoy diverse group interaction and be mature enough to work on your own initiative.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

One Higher at Grade C or above, in addition to three National 5, Intermediate 2 (Grade B or above) or Standard Grade Credit level qualifications, including English or other relevant subjects. Alternatively, applicants should have successfully completed a relevant course at SCQF Level 5. A genuine interest in working with people and good communication skills are essential.

ACCESS TO NURSING (SWAP) SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: PTOAN (City)

This course offers an excellent opportunity for those who would like to pursue a career in adult, mental health and children & young peoples nursing through a variety of universities. You may be considering a change of career or have worked in a support worker role and now wish to gain qualifications. Please note: This course is not suitable for school leavers or those wanting to undertake midwifery.

The Scottish Wider Access Programme (SWAP) supports access to higher education for adult learners. SWAP access programmes run at colleges across Scotland and are a route into hundreds of university degree courses. SWAP courses are specifically designed for adults who are returning to education after a gap.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You do not require any formal qualifications however you must be able to prove you can study at this level. If your last course of study was up to SCQF Level 5, you must have been out of full-time education for three years. If your last course of study was at SCQF Level 6 or above, you must have been out of full time education for five years. You will be invited to an interview with a member of the care team. This course is not suitable for anyone who has a degree.

HNC HEALTHCARE PRACTICE SCOF LEVEL 7

Course code: PTCL (City)

The purpose of this course is to prepare our future healthcare professionals to thrive within today's health and social care services. You will be provided with the skills, knowledge and critical ability to provide person-centred care. You will mainly work with people over the age of 16. This will include working with individuals, families and communities to promote health and well-being, prevention of ill health and enabling people to maintain and improve their mental and physical health. You will be expected to support individuals through all stages of the life cycle including end-of-life and palliative care. This course has two routes. Please state in the 'Tell us your story so far' section of the application process which you are interested in:

Non-Degree Link route: For those intending to apply for Year 1 of a Paramedic Practice, Midwifery or Children and Young People's Nursing degree on completing the course.

Degree Link route: For those wishing to articulate into Year 2 of an Adult or Mental Health nursing degree at RGU, or a Learning Disabilities nursing degree at Edinburgh Napier University after the course.

There is a large placement element to this course and you must be able to commit to shift work. You will have to complete 760 hours of placement on the Degree Link route and 400 hours on the non-Degree Link route. You will have to apply for a PVG through the college and you will have to pay for this before you attend a placement. You will also have to pay for Hepatitis B injections before commencing a placement.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two Highers (at Grade C or above), one of which should be in science, preferably Biology. Or Level 6 Health or Social Care course along with Higher Care at Grade C or above. For entry to Nursing you will be interviewed by a panel from RGU, NHS Grampian and NESCol. If you wish to progress to a Midwifery degree you must also hold Higher English at Grade C or above.

SOCIAL CARE SCQF LEVEL 5

Course code: PTMCA (City)

We are looking for thoughtful and considerate individuals who care about supporting others who may be vulnerable and in need of social care interventions. If you are a school leaver, looking to get back into employment after a break or would like a career change into the discipline of social care, this is a great starting point for you. You should enjoy diverse group interaction and be mature enough to work on your own initiative. We look for individuals who are enthusiastic with a positive attitude to learning and can show commitment to this one year course.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two National 5 passes at Grade C or above, preferably English, or two Standard Grades at General Level or equivalent. Alternatively, applicants should have successfully completed a relevant course at SCQF Level 4. Other qualifications and experience may be considered but the ability to work at SCQF Level 5 is essential. A genuine aptitude for working with people and good communication skills are essential.

ADVANCED SOCIAL CARE SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: PTMCR (City)

We are looking for thoughtful and considerate individuals who have a genuine interest in a career in social care or social work. At this advanced level, we would be looking for students who are genuinely committed to furthering their career development in this area and who have the desire to care about supporting those who are vulnerable within our society. School leavers enthusiastic about working in care or those who would like a career change and who may have had experience of caring for others should apply. You should enjoy diverse group interaction and be mature enough to work on your own initiative. This course will increase your understanding of a variety of care contexts and service users, effectively preparing you for further study or employment. You will also investigate care intervention, and the roles and responsibilities across associated professions.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

One Higher at Grade C or above, in addition to three National 5, Intermediate 2 (Grade B or above) or Standard Grade Credit level qualifications, including English. A genuine interest in working with people and good communication skills are essential.

HNC SOCIAL SERVICES SCOF LEVEL 7

Course code: PTCV (City)

We are looking for highly motivated, well-organised, disciplined and caring individuals whose goal it is to work in community, private or public services that support the most vulnerable members of our society to lead a fulfilled and independent life. Those interested in this course should be ready for a blended learning approach that includes independent study, group work, research activities and presentation skills. This course enables students to integrate knowledge, theory and practice to gain employment in a social care role, or to progress to further study at university degree level in order to embark on a career in social work.

Please note that a clear PVG will be required prior to placement allocation. This will be organised by the College, however you will have to pay for the PVG.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two Higher qualifications at Grade C or above (preferably including Higher English) and Maths, Numeracy or equivalent at National 5 (Grade C or above). If not held at Higher, English at National 5 is essential. Alternatively, applicants should have a relevant qualification at SCQF Level 6, e.g. Health or Social Care. It is desirable that applicants have completed a minimum of 80 hours work or voluntary experience within a social care setting. A genuine interest in working with people and good communication skills are essential, and references may be required.

ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSIONS (SWAP) ACCESS TO SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: PTOAH (City)

This exciting new programme has been developed by North East Scotland College and Robert Gordon University especially for mature students who have been out of education for some time and would like to pursue a career in occupational therapy, physiotherapy, paramedic science or midwifery. You may be considering a change of career or have worked in a support worker role and now wish to gain qualifications and find routes into the Allied Health Professions (AHP) at degree level. This new Scottish Wider Access Programme (SWAP) has been recognised by RGU as a suitable entry route for these AHP degrees and is an excellent opportunity for those of you with few or no formal qualifications to move on to higher education.

Please note: This course is not suitable for candidates applying straight from school or those who have studied at university level before. Please see other courses we offer if this applies to you e.g. Healthcare Level 5 or Healthcare Level 6.

The Scottish Wider Access Programme (SWAP) supports access to higher education for adult learners. SWAP access programmes run at colleges across Scotland and are a route into hundreds of university degree courses. SWAP courses are specifically designed for adults who are returning to education after a gap.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You do not require any formal qualifications however you must be able to prove you can study at this level. If your last course of study was up to SCQF Level 5, you must have been out of full-time education for at least three years. If your last course of study was at SCQF Level 6 or above, you must have been out of full-time education for five years or more. You will be interviewed by a member of the NESCol team to assess your suitability for the course.

CARE WITH ESOL SCQF LEVEL 4/5

Course code: PTMCS (City)

This is course for speakers of other languages who wish to pursue a career in the care professions (childcare, healthcare and social care). You will be given the opportunity to develop your English language skills and study a range of care subjects. The aim is to increase your knowledge and effectively prepare you for further study or employment in the sector.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Successful completion of an ESOL qualification or completion of a College English language test (strong B1 or equivalent), or three passes at National 4 or equivalent. A genuine interest and aptitude for working with children and vulnerable adults, good communication and numeracy skills..

INTRODUCTION TO CHILDCARE SCQF LEVEL 4

Course code: PSMCH (City) RJMCR (Fraserburgh)

The course provides students with a good base knowledge of the early education and childcare sectors. It provides an opportunity for students to develop their skills in a childcare context, whilst providing the opportunity to investigate a range of job roles and career opportunities.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Three National 4, Standard Grade General or Intermediate 1 qualifications, ideally including English. National 4s should be full courses rather than individual units. Other qualifications and experience may be considered, but the ability to work at SCQF Level 4 is essential. A genuine interest and aptitude for working with children and good communication and numeracy skills is very important.

CHILDCARE & DEVELOPMENT SCOF LEVEL 5

Course code: PSMCD (City) RJMCD (Fraserburgh)

This course is for progressing students, mature school leavers and those who would like to gain childcare qualifications. You must be able to embrace diversity and be able to work as part of a team as well as work independently. A placement opportunity may be provided to students who demonstrate appropriate skills and values.

Please note that a clear PVG disclosure will be required prior to placement allocation. PVG membership will be organised by the College.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Three National 4 and two National 5 qualifications at Grade C or above – one of which should be English. National 4s should be full courses rather than individual units. Evidence of volunteering or a placement within an early years/childcare environment is preferable (normally 20 hours).

NC EARLY EDUCATION & CHILDCARE SCOF LEVEL 6

Course code: PSOE (City) RJOEE (Fraserburgh)

Following on from the Childcare & Development course, this course allows students to develop knowledge and understanding of the Early Years/Childcare sector. Upon completion, candidates are eligible to register with the Scottish Social Services Council (SSSC) at support worker level. The course also provides candidates with the underpinning knowledge required for the HNC Childhood Practice course. A mandatory placement opportunity is provided to students who demonstrate the appropriate skills and values.

Please note that a clear PVG disclosure will be required prior to placement allocation. PVG membership will be organised by the College.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Four qualifications at National 5 (Grade B or above), Intermediate 2 or Standard Grade Credit level - one of which should be English and preferably Maths. National 5s should be full courses rather than individual units. Evidence of volunteering or a placement within an Early Years/childcare environment is preferable (normally 40 hours). Alternatively, an appropriate SCQF Level 5 course eg. Childcare and Development. Other qualifications and experience may be taken into account but the ability to work at SCQF Level 5 is essential.

HNC CHILDHOOD PRACTICE SCQF LEVEL 7

Course code: PSCC (City) RJCC (Fraserburgh)

This course develops essential skills, knowledge and understanding of current workplace practice, legislations, policies and frameworks required to work within in a childhood practice setting. Upon completion, candidates are eligible to register with the Scottish Social Services Council (SSSC) at practitioner level. This course provides a great opportunity to gain a nationally and professionally recognised group award.

Please note that a clear PVG disclosure will be required prior to placement allocation. PVG membership will be organised by the College.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS


Two Highers, one of which must be English at Grade C or above, and National 5 Maths/Applications of Maths. Alternatively, a relevant SCQF Level 6 course in a care related subject e.g. NC Early Education & Childcare or Foundation Apprenticeship: Social Services Children and Young People plus Higher English at Grade C or above and National 5 Maths/ Applications of Maths (the full course rather than individual units). It is preferable that applicants should have a minimum of 80 hours work experience in an early years or childcare setting.

BROADLY COMPARABLE TO SCOF LEVEL 4/5

Course code: QBMCL (City)

This course is designed to give you experience in programming, data science, hardware and networking to prepare you for further studies in computing. If you are thinking about a career in the sector, this is the perfect place to start. The experience gained throughout the course in a range of disciplines will help you to find the area that interests you most, which you can then study at a higher level.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

This course is suitable for those with no previous qualifications or work experience, but all applicants should have a genuine interest in computing.

ACCESS TO SOFTWARE DEVELOPMENT SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: QBMSD (City)

In today's tech-driven world, software development and cyber security skills are in high demand. This practical, hands-on course equips you with the essential programming languages, app development, and ethical hacking knowledge needed to begin an exciting career in the technology sector. You will work on real-world projects, like building a website, developing your own app, and using scripts to test system vulnerabilities. With a curriculum designed to prepare you for further computing qualifications, this course unlocks diverse career paths in software engineering, web development, IT security and more.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two National 5s at Grade C or above, preferably one in computing science or software development or a recognised computing course at Level 5.

ACCESS TO NETWORKING SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: QBMCO (City)

This course is designed to give you hands on experience in configuring networking and server hardware. Using the skills learned throughout the course you will be able to test the security of your network. The course will prepare you for further studies in computing at Level 7.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two National 5s at Grade C or above, one in computing science or a STEM related subject. Or progression from a recognised computing course at SCQF Level 5.

HNC COMPUTING (NEXTGEN) SCOF LEVEL 7

Course code: QBCN (City) RCCN (Fraserburgh)

Embark on an exhilarating journey in our cutting-edge computing course designed to empower you with a dynamic set of digital skills poised for the future! Dive into the fascinating realms of networking, software development, cyber security, artificial intelligence and the thrilling internet of things. Through a blend of handson individual and team projects, you'll not only master the essentials of these technologies but also cultivate a diverse range of meta-skills that will transform you into a true professional trailblazer. Get ready to unleash your potential in the exciting world of computing, where every challenge is an opportunity to innovate. This course is your gateway to a future of endless possibilities in the ever-evolving landscape of technology.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two Highers at Grade C or above, preferably including Computing Science. Students progressing from Advanced Computing at SCQF Level 6 can also gain entry to this course. Core Skills (Numeracy and Communications) at SCQF Level 5 are also required.

HND CYBER SECURITY SCOF LEVEL 7/8

Course code: OBDY (City)

The need for cyber security specialists in the modern workplace is paramount, all organisations have an obligation to ensure that their network, applications and data is secure. This course will provide you with the skills to meet the industry requirements. We will introduce you to Networking and what practices we can put in place to secure a network from attacks, you will learn about programming and how this can help you become a better cyber security specialist, and we will introduce you to the laws that affect cyber security specialists and the effects that these laws can have on companies and individuals.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two Highers at Grade C or above – preferably one in Computing Science. A Foundation Apprenticeship will be considered equivalent to one unrelated Higher for entry to this course. Students progressing from Advanced Computing (SCQF Level 6) can also gain entry to this course. Students must have Numeracy Core Skills and Communication both at Level 4 or Higher.

HND NETWORKING & CLOUD INFRASTRUCTURE (NEXTGEN)

SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: QBDG (City)

This course will allow students to study many of the skills that are in demand for many different types of career in an IT technical support role. The course provides a comprehensive range of knowledge and practical skills in providing technical expertise in PC maintenance, networking, installing Microsoft Windows, desktop support, and server support. In specialist labs, learners will have the opportunity to build PCs, study the Microsoft Windows operating systems, and build networks within a virtualised environment providing hands on experience and learning. HND Networking & Cloud Infrastructure (NextGen) SCQF Level 8 is expected to lead to employment opportunities at IT support technician level or progress to third year of a related degree through one of our university articulation agreements. NextGen is a new approach to Higher National qualifications introduced by the SQA and designed to be adaptable and flexible to respond to the needs of the employment market. ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

HNC Computing or Year 1 of HND Computing: Software Development or Year 1 of HND Computing: Technical Support.

HND COMPUTING: SOFTWARE DEVELOPMENT (NEXTGEN)

SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: QBDX (City)

Software is everywhere! More and more devices are controlled by software and the industry is constantly evolving as we continue to move towards an era where computers and software dominate our lives. You will learn programming languages that will prepare you for a career in this ever changing industry, as you focus on Human Computer Interaction and making your programmes and software more user friendly. Smart home devices such as the Amazon Alexa, Google Home or even the Apple Homepod were developed using the skills you will learn on this course. Find out more at **www.sqa.org.uk**

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

HNC Computing or Year 1 of HND Computing: Software Development or Year 1 of HND Computing: Technical Support.

INTRODUCTION TO COMPUTER GAMES DESIGN [INCLUDING INTRODUCTION TO ESPORTS] SCQF LEVEL 4/5

Course code: QAMGD (City) RCMGD (Fraserburgh)

This is the first step for those interested in a career in games development and Esports. This course will introduce learners to the genres, trends and emerging technologies of the computer games industry. This course provides a foundation in techniques that are important to the sector, such as digital planning and design, creation of media assets, and development and testing - while also developing employability skills and core skills through enterprise activities. Students will be introduced to Esports, will explore video game characters, narrative design, creating an Esports brand, organising an Esports tournament and live-stream broadcasting.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

This course can be undertaken without previous experience of computer games development. There are no formal entry requirements.

COMPUTER GAME DESIGN SCOF LEVEL 6

Course code: QAMGC (City) RCMGC (Fraserburgh)

This course focuses on the technical and creative skills desired by employers, in the computer games industry and in the wider creative digital media and software development sectors. Students will work together to effectively contribute to an Esports organisation, content creation as well as organising an Esports tournament. The award includes the softer skills regarded as important in the computer games industry including communication, team working and an understanding of the role of enterprise.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of four subject passes (Grade C or better) at National 5, Intermediate 2 or Standard Grade Credit level and Level 5 core skills of Communication and Numeracy. Alternatively, applicants should have relevant work experience or successful completion of a relevant prior course at SCQF Level 5.

HND GAMES DESIGN [INCLUDING DIGITAL DESIGN & DEVELOPMENT] SCOF LEVEL 8

Course code: QADG (City)

This practical course will build on your design and technical abilities, and ensure you have the skills and knowledge to effectively implement your ideas and designs within game development. You will work on individual game projects allowing you to develop an in-depth and accurate understanding of professional standards and what to expect, when working in a game design/development-related role.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

One relevant Higher together with three National 5 courses, all to be at least Grade C. Alternatively, successful completion of Computing with Digital Media Level 5 course, or Computer Games Development Level 6 course. A Foundation Apprenticeship in any subject area will be considered equivalent to one unrelated Higher for entry to this course. For those returning to education, life skills and experience in the workplace may allow entry subject to availability.

HNC WEB DEVELOPMENT (INCLUDING DIGITAL DESIGN & DEVELOPMENT) SCQF LEVEL 7

Course code: QACW (City)

This very practical course will build on your design and technical abilities, and ensure you have the skills and knowledge to effectively implement your ideas and designs. These skills can be used to develop skills in Web Development. You will be using the latest in industry software within Adobe's Creative Cloud. You will work on real projects with real clients, allowing you to develop an in-depth and accurate understanding of professional standards and what to expect when working in a web related role.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

One relevant Higher (SCQF Level 6) together with three National 5 courses, all to be at least Grade C. A Foundation Apprenticeship in any subject area will be considered equivalent to one unrelated Higher for entry to this course. Alternatively, successful completion of Computing with Digital Media Level 5, or Computer Games Development Level 6 course. For those returning to education, life skills and experience in the workplace may allow entry subject to availability.

HND WEB DEVELOPMENT (INCLUDING DIGITAL DESIGN & DEVELOPMENT) SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: QADW (City)

This very practical course will build on your design and technical abilities, and ensure you have the skills and knowledge to effectively implement your ideas and designs. These skills can be used to develop skills in Web Development. You will be using the latest in industry software within Adobe's Creative Cloud. You will work on real projects with real clients, allowing you to develop an in-depth and accurate understanding of professional standards and what to expect when working in a web related role.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

One relevant Higher (SCQF Level 6) together with three National 5 courses, all to be at least Grade C. A Foundation Apprenticeship in any subject area will be considered equivalent to one unrelated Higher for entry to this course. Alternatively, successful completion of Computing with Digital Media Level 5, or Computer Games Development Level 6 course. For those returning to education, life skills and experience in the workplace may allow entry subject to availability.



Course code: QRMWS (Altens) RAMWS (Fraserburgh)

This course will provide you with a thorough introduction to basic construction craft skills. Most of your time will be spent in our bright, well-equipped workshops where you will practice using a range of tools in a range of trades such as carpentry and joinery, brickwork, painting and decorating.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements but we are looking for looking for enthusiastic, motivated individuals who are good team players and enjoy working with tools in a workshop environment. An interest in construction is desirable.



CONSTRUCTION CRAFTS SCOF LEVEL 5

Course code: QRMG (Altens) RAMF (Fraserburgh)

This course will provide you with an opportunity to progress skills in a range of construction craft occupations. Most of your time will be spent in our bright, well equipped workshops where you will practice use of tools in a range of trades such as carpentry and joinery, brickwork, painting and decorating and plumbing.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements but we are looking for enthusiastic, motivated individuals who are good team players, health and safety aware and enjoy working with tools in a workshop environment. In addition, you will develop essential general life skills such as adaptability, teamwork and how to deal with people which will set you up for the future regardless of your chosen career path.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Qualifications at National 5, Intermediate 2 or Standard Grade Credit level, preferably including English, a science subject and Numeracy as well as National 4, Intermediate 1 or Standard Grade General Level Maths as a minimum. Other qualifications at National 4 or 5 level will be considered. You will also be given an aptitude test at interview. Please note applicants must be 16 or over.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this course.



SVQ LEVEL 2 PERFORMING ENGINEERING OPERATIONS: ELECTRICAL ROUTE SCOF LEVEL 5

Course code: QNSP (Altens) RCSR (Fraserburgh)

Introducing you to practical electrical/electronic installation, maintenance and testing skills.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Course code: RBSM (Fraserburgh)

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal academic qualifications required for entrance onto this course but we are looking for enthusiastic, motivated individuals who are good team players and enjoy working with tools in a workshop environment.



SVQ PERFORMING ENGINEERING OPERATIONS: MECHANICAL MANUFACTURE ROUTE SCOF LEVEL 5

Course code: RBSP (Fraserburgh)

This course will build on Mechanical Manufacture skills and knowledge gained in the Level 2 qualification. The course is a mandatory component for those in employment who are undertaking a Modern Apprenticeship at Craft, Technician or Graduate level.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

NC ENGINEERING SYSTEMS: RENEWABLES SCQF LEVEL 5

Course code: QPOS (Altens)

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Progression from PEO courses with the Maths modules. Direct entry requires National 5 Maths at Grade D or better, National 5 English at Grade C or better, and a practical subject. Experience may be taken into consideration for mature applicants.



NC ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING SCOF LEVEL 5

Course code: QNOR (Altens) RCOR (Fraserburgh)

This course is perfect for those who want to be multi-skilled in electrical and mechanical disciplines. The course includes the principles of electrical and mechanical engineering and will develop your skills in both disciplines.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants should have completed an SVQ Level 2 PEO with the addition of maths requirements. Direct entry applicants should have attained National 5 Maths with at least Grade C or D. Experience may also be taken into consideration for mature applicants.



NC MECHANICAL ENGINEERING: MECHANICAL MANUFACTURE ROUTE SCOF LEVEL 5

Course code: RBOM (Fraserburgh)

This course will build on welding and fabrication skills and knowledge gained during the SVQ Performing Engineering Operations Level 2 qualification. You will enhance your skills and knowledge on engineering materials, graphical engineering communication, CAD, and engineering principles and how to perform vital processes such as measurement, milling operations, CNC skills, Dimensional control, manufacturing processes along with employability skills such as IT, maths, communication and health and safety practice.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must have completed an SVQ Level 2 Performing Engineering Operations with the addition of a maths unit.



NC MECHANICAL ENGINEERING: MECHANICAL MAINTENANCE ROUTE SCQF LEVEL 5

Course code: RBOT (Fraserburgh)

This course will build on welding and fabrication skills and knowledge gained during the SVQ Performing Engineering Operations Level 2 qualification. You will enhance your skills and knowledge on engineering materials, graphical engineering communication, CAD, Prime Mover, engineering principles, MIG welding, dimensional control, employability skills such as IT, maths, communication and health and safety practice.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must have completed an SVQ Level 2 Performing Engineering Operations with the addition of a maths unit.



NC MECHANICAL ENGINEERING: FABRICATION & WELDING ROUTE SCQF LEVEL 5

Course code: RBOW (Fraserburgh)

This course will build on welding and fabrication skills and knowledge gained during the SVQ Performing Engineering Operations Level 2 qualification. You will enhance your skills and knowledge on fabrication processes, welding processes, MIG welding, TIG welding, MMA welding, fabrication skills, CAD along with employability skills such as IT, maths, communication and health and safety practice.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must have completed an SVQ Level 2 Performing Engineering Operations with the addition of a maths unit.



NC ENGINEERING SYSTEMS SCOF LEVEL 6

Course code: RCOS (Fraserburgh)

This course provides you with the opportunity to study differing engineering disciplines allowing you to make an informed decision on the right progression path towards higher engineering qualifications.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

National 5 Maths at Grade A or B, Standard Grade Maths at Credit level or Intermediate 2 Maths including units 1, 2, and 3. Alternatively, applicants should have an NC in Engineering at SCQF Level 5 with both Mathematics Craft 1 and Craft 2 units.



NC ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING SCOF LEVEL 6

Course code: QNOT (Altens)

This course is perfect for those who like maths, sciences and problem solving and have ambition to progress.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Course code: RCNSG (Fraserburgh)

This is a fast track advanced course looking for next generation of engineering technicians – have you got what it takes? The Shell Engineering Scheme is exclusive to NESCol's Fraserburgh Campus. This is a sponsored programme designed to meet the demand of today's engineering sector. It delivers a broad knowledge and skill set for electrical, mechanical and instrumentation engineering. Four full time qualifications are delivered over two years together with a leadership qualification and industrial placements. Candidates can expect to receive an attendance allowance of approximately £100 per week.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

National 5 Maths at Grade B or above or NC in Engineering at SCQF Level 5 with both Maths Craft 1 and Craft 2 units.



HNC ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING SCQF LEVEL 7

Course code: QNCT (Altens) RCCR (Fraserburgh)

This highly sought after qualification will allow you to develop advanced understanding and capabilities in electrical engineering principles and practices, equipping you with the skills required to work in industry, public sector and service organisations.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Grade B in Higher Maths or equivalent qualification in maths, and one other Higher in English or a related science/technology qualification.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Grade A or B in Higher Maths or equivalent qualification in Maths. Alternatively, students who have attained the NC Mechanical Engineering Level 6, including Technician 2 Maths, may progress to HND if they have shown good attendance and motivation to progress. National 5 Applications of Maths is not accepted for this course.

Course code: PMQRB (City)

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Alternatively, applicants should have appropriate life or work experience, demonstrating the ability to develop and learn essential skills.



QUALIFICATION FOR WORK: HOSPITALITY SCOF LEVEL 4

Course code: QJOHL (City)

You will gain knowledge and skills in Hospitality as well as have the opportunity to undertake a relevant work placement. You will develop your core skills in numeracy and communication, and your knowledge of mental health.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

This course is suitable for candidates successfully progressing from Qualification for Work, and who have shown the ability to work at Level 4 with support.

CREATIVE MEDIA SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: PCMCM (City)

In the next few years, it is expected that job creation in the creative industries will be greater than in the general labour market. The Creative Media course is primarily a practical course. ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants should have a minimum of three course passes at National 5 level or equivalent. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

HND MEDIA & COMMUNICATION: PRODUCTION SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: PCDU (City)

On this course, you will develop a wide range of skills in broadcast production and theory, enhancing employability within the media and other related industries Based at Aberdeen City Campus you will have access to excellent facilities including a radio studio, photography studios and industry-standard post-production facilities. In addition, you will have opportunities to collaborate with a host of other disciplines. In previous years, students have collaborated on a range of media projects in the form of client-led briefs with high-profile clients such as the Scottish Parliament, Scottish Social Services, STV and the National Trust for Scotland.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two Higher qualifications, at Grade C or above, preferably in English or a similar subject. Alternatively, applicants should have successfully completed an appropriate non-advanced College course. For those returning to education, life skills and experience in the workplace may allow entry subject to interview. All applicants should show an interest in, and aptitude for the subject.

HND MEDIA & COMMUNICATION: JOURNALISM SCOF LEVEL 8

Course code: PCDT (City)

This course is ideal for those seeking the skills to begin a career in a communications role – whether that is in journalism, marketing, PR or advertising – and for those wishing to continue their education in these fields at university. HNC TELEVISION (NEXTGEN) SCQF LEVEL 7

Course code: PCCV (City)

HND TELEVISION (NEXTGEN) SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: PCDV (City)

These courses are for those interested in pursuing a career in television/ filmmaking media and who wish to develop the knowledge and creative and technical skills required for the television industry, freelance, corporate video and filmmaking. Using industry-standard equipment in purpose-built facilities, students will learn the technical process of filmmaking from using cameras, lighting, and sound, through to the final editing process. 

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A passion for the study of music and sound. The ability to selforganise, manage time and complete tasks individually and with others. Creativity. A basic level of instrumental and/or vocal skills.

MUSIC BROADLY COMPARABLE TO SCOF LEVEL 6

Course code: PBMMU (City)

Are you a musician who has a passion to develop your career in the music industry? Would you like the opportunity to work with like-minded musicians on a range of musical projects and uncover your creative potential? Whether you're into composing, songwriting, live performing, music production, music business or all of these, then Music level 6 is the course for you.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of three passes at National 5 level (or equivalent) or successful completion of Introduction to Music (SCQF Level 5). For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

HND MUSIC SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: PBDM (City)

This course is aimed at musicians looking to strengthen their skill set and prepare for a career in the music industry. It will heighten your understanding of music and musical trends whilst exploring a wide range of technical aspects, where practical skills will be honed and refined to the standard required for progression to degree level study or employment.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of two course passes at Higher level or equivalent, including Music. Alternatively, applicants may have completed an appropriate non-advanced course at Level 6 demonstrating an aptitude for the subject area. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry. Advanced entry directly to year 2 is possible for those who have completed 15 credits from HNC Music.

SOUND PRODUCTION BROADLY COMPARABLE TO SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: PBMSP (City)

The course will provide appropriate learning experiences in sound production at a non-advanced level. You will gain an understanding of the infrastructure of the music and audio industries and develop sound production skills.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of three course passes at National 5 level or equivalent. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

HND SOUND PRODUCTION SCOF LEVEL 8

Course code: PBDP (City)

This course is for those who want to work in professional audio environments. The course will train you in the specification, utilisation and deployment of professional audio equipment, as well as how to operate in the professional sound reinforcement and recording fields. You will strengthen your understanding of working in the creative industries, and get the chance to make full use of our state-of-the-art facilities.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of two course passes at Higher level or equivalent.
Alternatively, applicants may have successfully completed Sound Production (Level 6), or another appropriate non- advanced course at Level 6 demonstrating an aptitude for the subject area. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry. Advanced entry directly to year 2 is possible for those who have completed 15 credits from HNC Sound Production.

PERFORMING ARTS: DRAMA BROADLY COMPARABLE TO SCOF LEVEL 6

Course code: PBMAT (City)

Are you thinking about a career in the performing arts? Would you like the opportunity to develop your acting skills through working with like-minded individuals on a range of activities to uncover your creative potential? Whether you're into acting, directing or devising your own scenes then this is the course for you.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of three course passes at National 5 level or equivalent. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

HND ACTING & PERFORMANCE SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: PBDC (City)

This advanced level course will allow you to develop your skills with a view to working in one of the most vibrant and competitive areas of the creative industries: the performing arts. Participants on this course take part in productions; develop skills in movement, acting, voice, technical theatre and devising. We work in closely with a range of industry partners and our students benefit from a range of opportunities such as visits from guest practitioners, theatre trips, specialist training and the chance to get involved with our live productions.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of two course passes at Higher level or equivalent.
All applicants are required to attend an audition. Alternatively, applicants may have completed an appropriate non-advanced course at Level 6 demonstrating an aptitude for the subject area. For those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry. Advanced entry directly to year 2 is possible for those who have completed 15 credits from HNC Acting & Performance.





NC APPLIED SCIENCE SCOF LEVEL 5

Course code: QCOA (City) QCOB (Fraserburgh)

This course will increase your understanding of scientific principles and practice, and is aimed at those who have limited formal qualifications in science. A particularly large amount of the course will involve stimulating practical activities, experiments and laboratory work ensuring the course is exciting, engaging and informative. Examples of practical activities might include the study of microbial growth in foodstuffs, the production of electricity from chemicals and the applications of physics to forensic investigations.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

It is not necessarily essential to hold previous qualifications in science subjects, but you should be comfortable studying at SCQF Level 5 and should hold National 5s at Grade C in relevant subjects. You should also have good numeracy skills. You may also progress to this course from our 'Introduction to Science' course.



NC APPLIED SCIENCE SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: QCOS (City)

As well as providing a sound theoretical understanding of science to allow future study at HNC/D or university, this course will also involve a great deal of practical work which will be of direct relevance to local interests, industries or topical issues. This will ensure you acquire a broad base of laboratory knowledge and expertise, of great value in the job market. Examples of practical activities might include testing of aerodynamic design and efficiency by use of a wind tunnel, synthesis and testing of biodiesels and the study of how enzymes work in our bodies.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

National 5 Grade B, or equivalent, in a minimum of two science disciplines and Maths. Applications of Maths at National 5 may be considered where there is evidence of strong qualifications in science subjects. Where an applicant only has prior qualifications in one science subject, this may still allow entry providing there is evidence of strong qualifications in other subjects. Alternatively, applicants could progress to this following completion of NC Applied Science SCQF Level 5.

SCIENCE: ROUTES TO HIGHER EDUCATION SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: QCHS (City)

This is an academically challenging course involving the study for four SQA Highers which will prepare you thoroughly for further study in science and related disciplines at HNC and HND level or university. You will be provided with lessons in small group sessions, supported by further tutorial slots. This will help ensure you are fully prepared for the final examinations.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants should hold National 5 or Intermediate 2 qualifications (Grades BBBB) or Standard Grade Credit level qualifications (Grades 2222) in their four selected subjects, (please note National 5 Applications of Maths is not accepted). For those wishing to study Environmental Science either Geography or Biology may be counted as alternative entrance qualifications to National 5 Environmental Science. Entry is also available for those who have completed our NC Level 5 or NC Level 6 Applied Science programmes.



HNC APPLIED SCIENCE (CHEMISTRY/BIOLOGY ROUTE) SCOF LEVEL 7

Course code: QCCAP (City)

This is a wide-ranging course covering the theoretical and practical aspects of modern sciences. You will specialise in two of the major branches of science – chemistry and biology. The course also includes a large amount of training in essential practical skills and the use of modern analytical instrumentation of direct relevance to local and national employers. Scientific communication and presentation skills are also developed, which along with the extensive laboratory skills and scientific theoretical knowledge gained ensures that our HNC and HND graduates are highly sought after by employers.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Higher qualifications in Chemistry and Biology/Human Biology, or a Higher in one of these subjects and a National 5 (minimum Grade B) or equivalent in the other. Maths at National 5 (Grade C) or equivalent is also required (National 5 Applications of Maths is not accepted). Alternatively, applicants should have successfully completed the NC Applied Science (SCQF Level 6) course at Grade B or above.



HND APPLIED SCIENCE (CHEMISTRY/BIOLOGY ROUTE) SCOF LEVEL 8

Course code: QCDAP (City)

This is a wide-ranging course covering the theoretical and practical aspects of modern sciences. You will specialise in two of the major branches of science – chemistry and biology. This will provide the opportunity to further enhance practical skills and innovation, project management and presentation. These aspects will prove of great value as you progress to further study or employment.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Higher qualifications in Chemistry and Biology/Human Biology, or a Higher in one of these subjects and a National 5 (minimum Grade B) or equivalent in the other. Maths at National 5 (minimum Grade C) or equivalent is also required (National 5 Applications of Maths is not accepted). Alternatively, applicants should have successfully completed the NC Applied Science (SCQF Level 6) course at Grade B or above.



HNC APPLIED SCIENCE (CHEMISTRY/PHYSICS ROUTE) SCOF LEVEL 7

Course code: QCCAH (City)

This is a wide-ranging course covering the theoretical and practical aspects of modern sciences. You will specialise in two of the major branches of science – chemistry and physics. The course also includes a large amount of training in essential practical skills and the use modern analytical instrumentation of direct relevance to local and national employers. Scientific communication and presentation skills are also developed, which along with the extensive laboratory skills and scientific theoretical knowledge gained ensures that our HNC and HND graduates are highly sought after by employers.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Higher qualifications in Chemistry and Physics, or a Higher in one of these subjects and a National 5 (minimum Grade B) or equivalent in the other. Maths at National 5 (minimum Grade B) or equivalent will also be essential (National 5 Applications of Maths is not accepted). Alternatively, applicants should have completed the NC Applied Science (SCQF Level 6) course at Grade B or above.



HND APPLIED SCIENCE (CHEMISTRY/PHYSICS ROUTE) SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: QCDAH (City)

This is a wide-ranging course covering the theoretical and practical aspects of modern sciences. You will specialise in two of the major branches of science – chemistry and physics. This wide-ranging, advanced level course covers theoretical and practical aspects of physics and chemistry. A large amount of hands-on training is involved, giving you a chance to put theory into practice and develop valuable skills in experimentation, analytical testing and modern instrumentation in physics and chemistry.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Higher qualifications in Chemistry and Physics, or a Higher in one of these subjects and a National 5 (minimum Grade B) or equivalent in the other. Maths at National 5 (minimum grade B) or equivalent will also be essential (National 5 Applications of Maths is not accepted). Alternatively, applicants should have completed the NC Applied Science (SCQF Level 6) course at Grade B or above.

ACCESS TO MEDICAL & LIFE SCIENCES (SWAP) SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: OCOAM (City)

This is an intensive course which aims to prepare you academically, and to give you the opportunity to develop the skills and confidence you need, for entry into university or HNC/D courses. As well as providing a sound grounding in the theoretical basis of medical and life sciences, the course contains a significant amount of stimulating practical activities. Much of the practical work will be of direct relevance to local interests, industries or topical issues, and will ensure you acquire a broad base of laboratory knowledge and expertise. Please note that all applicants must meet the below eligibility criteria.

The Scottish Wider Access Programme (SWAP) supports access to higher education for adult learners. SWAP access programmes run at colleges across Scotland and are a route into hundreds of university degree courses. SWAP courses are specifically designed for adults who are returning to education after a gap.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You don't have any qualifications above SCQF Level 5 (Standard Grade, Intermediate 2 or equivalent) and have been out of full-time education for at least three years

You don't have qualifications above SCQF 6 or 7 (Highers, HN or equivalent) and have been out of full-time education for 5 years or more

You can undertake a science course such as NC Applied Sciences (SCQF Level 5) the year before you undertake the SWAP course

FORENSIC SCIENCE & BIOTECHNOLOGY SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: QCMF (City)

Forensic science is a crucial part of crime scene investigation, using scientific techniques to analyse and piece together the evidence to be presented during a court case and help solve the crime. Biotechnology explores how some of these techniques, and others, can be used to harness biological processes for use in industry. This includes interesting topics like vaccine production, DNA analysis and genetic engineering. This Level 6 course is a great stepping stone to further study with NESCol via the HND Biotechnology or HNC/D Applied Science which can lead to a range of exciting careers or direct entry to year 3 of a large range of degree programmes.


ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

National 5 qualifications (or equivalent) in two science subjects (at minimum Grade B) and Maths. Where an applicant only has prior qualifications in one science subject, this may still allow entry providing there is evidence of strong qualifications in other subjects. Alternatively, applicants could progress to this course following completion of our NC Applied Science (SCQF Level 5) course.



Course code: QGMSS (City) RMMSC (Fraserburgh)

This is a new and exciting course that will introduce you to different social science subjects such as sociology, psychology, modern studies, citizenship and mental health and wellbeing that will develop your understanding of what makes us both human and social. Through studying human behaviour and society you will aim to develop a range of essential skills that will improve your communication skills, self-awareness and confidence, digital skills, self-management, social intelligence and innovation skills.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Passes at National 4 and National 5 level or equivalent. Life skills and experience may allow entry.

SOCIAL SCIENCES:

PERSPECTIVES ON 21ST CENTURY SOCIETY & CULTURE SCOF LEVEL 6

Course code: QGMH (City) RMMH (Fraserburgh)

There has never been a better time to study social sciences. This exciting and relevant course includes social science subjects such as sociology, psychology, criminology, philosophy, social anthropology, social research, counselling and a historical/political investigation of contemporary issues. Through studying perspectives on 21st Century society and culture you will aim to develop a range of essential skills that will improve your communication skills, self-awareness and confidence, digital skills, self-management, social intelligence and innovation skills.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum of three passes at National 5 level or equivalent. Alternatively applicants should have successfully achieved an appropriate Level 5 course. Life skills and experience may allow entry.

ACCESS TO SOCIAL SCIENCES, ARTS & EDUCATION (SWAP) SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: QGOAA (City)

This course offers an excellent opportunity for those who would like to progress to university in an undergraduate degree in the arts, social sciences or education. This will be ideal for anyone wishing a change of career and considering a career in primary teaching. The SWAP programme is built from SQA Units and involves one-year-full-time study. The units selected on the Access to Arts, Social Sciences and Education programme are those that have been agreed with the partner Higher Education Institutions. In addition to the academic units, SWAP students also study a unit called Preparation for Higher Education. This includes core skills, study skills, reflective exercises on student progress and visits to universities.

The Scottish Wider Access Programme (SWAP) supports access to higher education for adult learners. SWAP access programmes run at colleges across Scotland and are a route into hundreds of university degree courses. SWAP courses are specifically designed for adults who are returning to education after a gap.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You do not need any formal qualifications, however:

HND year 2 (SCQF Level 8) is available at City only

This advanced level course will strengthen your existing knowledge and understanding when it comes to human behaviour and human society. You will use critical thinking to analyse different issues and build valuable evaluative and problem solving skills. You will also develop sound research skills – a vital component in the understanding and study of social sciences.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum of two relevant Highers (English, Psychology, RMPS, History, Modern Studies, Geography, Business Management) at Grade C or above. Alternatively, applicants should have achieved an appropriate Level 6 course. Life skills and experience may allow entry.

INTRODUCTION TO SPORT COACHING, EXERCISE & FITNESS SCOF LEVEL 4/5

Course code: PNNST (City) RGNST (Fraserburgh)

This course will help you develop introductory skills relevant to the sport and leisure industry in order to start a career in this field. It is designed to offer progression towards further academic study or entry level employment within the sport and leisure industry. You will also develop essential skills that are valued by employers and higher education whilst developing a good understanding of the vocational sector. The course will be delivered through a combination of both theory and practical classes. You will develop a basic understanding of the different systems of the body, planning gym sessions, develop coaching skills, problem solving, teamwork and communication skills.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

No formal qualifications are required, however, you must have a keen interest in the subject and have the commitment to study at SCQF Level 4/5. Appropriate life or work experience will also be considered for entry to this course. Suitable candidates will be invited to attend an interview which includes a group presentation, one to one interview and a practical team building activity.

ADVANCED SPORT COACHING, FITNESS & EXERCISE SCOF LEVEL 5/6

Course code: PNNSA (City) RGNSA (Fraserburgh)

This course is ideal if you have a passion for sport coaching, fitness and exercise, and are driven to stay active. The course includes a Level 2 Gym Instructor qualification, NPA in Achieving Excellence in Sport and Emergency First Aid at Work qualifications. It is designed for learners to develop their knowledge and skill within sport and fitness industry. Learners may be given the opportunity to work with external partners such as SFA ViP Award, Aberdeen FC, Sport Aberdeen, Aberdeen Sports Village and NESCol Sport Camps as part of their volunteering unit.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A range of National 5s, including PE and English (grade C or above), or successful completion of Introduction to Sport Coaching, Exercise and Fitness (SCQF Level 4/5). Relevant industry experience or equivalent qualification will also be considered. Suitable candidates will be invited to attend an interview which includes a group presentation, one to one interview and a practical team building activity.

HND SPORTS COACHING & DEVELOPMENT SCOF LEVEL 8

Course code: PNDS (City)

This course will provide an overview and introduction to the disciplines within the sports coaching and development industry. It provides an exciting mix of practical subjects, which are studied alongside related theory, giving you the opportunity to develop new skills, improve on existing skills and gain an in-depth understanding of sports coaching and development subjects. Learners will visit and participate in a variety of sporting events and festivals and be given the opportunity to gain additional sports and fitness qualifications. The course will provide learners with an industry-recognised qualification, and the knowledge and skills necessary to work as a professional within the sports industry in a variety of contexts. Embedded within the course are varied National Governing Body Awards in a variety of sporting delivery. The course provides learners with the industry-recognised PDA qualification certified by SportScotland/CIMSPA (Level 2 and 3 Coaching Framework).

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum of two Highers (one must be PE and the other in a relevant subject such as a science, Maths or English) at Grade C or above and successful interview. Completion of an NPA in Exercise Leadership plus one additional higher would also be considered. Alternatively, Advanced Sport Coaching, Exercise and Fitness or equivalent. Industrybased experience would also be considered upon interview for those without previous qualifications. Applicants whose first language is not English should have a minimum B2 English Language Level (National 5), an entry test can be arranged if you do not have a B2 qualification.

HND FITNESS, HEALTH & EXERCISE SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: PNDF (City)

If you wish to work in the areas of fitness, health and exercise instruction then this course is the perfect option. You will study a wide variety of subjects spanning the whole spectrum of sport science and fitness leadership, as well as a PDA in Personal Training. You will develop a wide range of fitness leadership and exercise prescription skills whilst building a good understanding of the key underpinning scientific principles that support practical performance. This course provides the opportunity to gain membership with Chartered Institute for the Management of Sport and Physical Activity (CIMSPA). CIMSPA is the professional development body for the UK's sport and physical activity sector, offering Scottish Colleges support with student and practitioner membership alongside partnership opportunities. CIMSPA has identified the standards for professional excellence and best practice in the sport and physical activity sector, members and partners are recognised for upholding and delivering these standards.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum of two Highers (one must be PE and the other in a relevant subject such as a science. Maths or English) at Grade C or above and successful interview. Alternatively, completion of an NPA in Exercise Leadership plus one additional higher would also be considered. NCFE Level 3 Sport or equivalent. Industry-based experience would also be considered upon interview for those without previous qualifications. Applicants whose first language is not English should have a minimum B2 English Language Level (National 5), an entry test can be arranged if you do not have a B2 qualification.

LEVEL 2 DIPLOMA FOR ENTRY TO THE UNIFORMED SERVICES SCOF LEVEL 4/5

Course code: PNNFM (City) RGNFM (Fraserburgh)

This course allows learners to learn about the specific uniformed services and the employment opportunities within them. You will have the opportunity to investigate various uniformed and emergency services and their recruitment process. We provide key links with representatives of these services through presentations, practical team building activities and outdoor skills events. You will get the opportunity to visit emergency and uniformed services throughout the course. The course will help you develop your knowledge and strengthen essential skills such as communication, problem-solving, leadership and teamwork which are required by the uniformed services. This will be achieved through participation in a range of challenging and realistic activities.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

No formal qualifications are required, however, you must have a keen interest in the subject. Applicants will be invited to attend an interview. You must demonstrate that you have the commitment to study at SCQF Level 4/5 and an interest in the subject area.

LEVEL 3 CERTIFICATE FOR ENTRY TO THE UNIFORMED SERVICES


BROADLY COMPARABLE TO SCQF LEVEL 5/6

Course code: PNNFT (City) RGNFT (Fraserburgh)

This course allows students to learn about specific uniformed services and the career opportunities within them. The different work-related units allow students to build key skills and understanding relating to realistic workplace situations activities and demands – effectively preparing you for work in the uniformed services (Police, Fire and Rescue Service, Prison Service, Ambulance, Army, Royal Navy, Royal Marines and Royal Air Force).


ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Successful completion of the Level 2 Diploma for Entry to the Uniformed Services (SCQF Level 4/5). Must attend an interview and have the commitment to study at SCQF Level 5/6. Must demonstrate an interest in studying uniformed services.

DISCOVER TRAVEL & TOURISM SCOF LEVEL 5

Course code: QHMTT (City)

This course gives those who wish to work in travel and tourism, or other customer-facing industries, the skills and knowledge needed to do so.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Passes at National 4 and National 5 level or equivalent. For school leavers and those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

TRAVEL, TOURISM & AVIATION SCQF LEVEL 6

Course code: QHOTR (City)

Develop your knowledge of the travel industry with an additional focus on air cabin crew. This course will cover units including airport ground operations, activity tourism, dynamic package holidays and working as air cabin crew.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum of three passes at National 5 level or equivalent or successful achievement of an appropriate SCQF Level 5 course. For school leavers and those returning to education, life skills and experience may allow entry.

HND TRAVEL & TOURISM SCQF LEVEL 8

Course code: QHDT (City)

The course is designed to produce industry-ready students. Career opportunities in this, one of the world's largest sectors, are almost endless - think cruise lines, airlines, airports, business travel, tour reps, cabin crew, customer services, hospitality and much more! Alternatively, many will use this course to progress towards university level study where you can enter year 3 of selected degree courses.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum of two Highers including subjects such as English, History, Geography, Psychology, Sociology, Modern Studies, Philosophy or RMPS. Alternatively, successful achievement of an appropriate Level 6 course. Life skills and experience may allow entry.

No formal qualifications are required. You must be at least 16 years old and hold a basic level of core skills.


DECK OFFICER CADET PROGRAMME SCQF LEVEL 7

The programme consists of five phases, over three years, and is a combination of Academy based learning and seatime. Upon completion you will gain the MCA Officer of the Watch Certificate of Competency and an HNC in Nautical Science. Places are sponsored by shipping companies and further information is available by contacting us. Your application process will be directed via the shipping companies.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum entry requirements are four Standard Grades at 1-3 or four National 5 passes. Subjects must include English, Maths and one science subject. You will be required to pass a seafarer medical test (ENG 1).
