BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE (BYOD) PROGRAMME

Thank you for applying to study at North East Scotland College (NESCol). The new academic term is just around the corner and I am sure that by now, you are beginning to get excited about the prospect of commencing or continuing your studies at NESCol.

The course that you have applied for is a Bring Your Own Device, or BYOD, programme. This means that you are required to have access to your own laptop computer, netbook or similar device in class each day that you are in college.

Having access to your own personal device will enable you to access appropriate materials during classes (using our wireless network) and will also allow you to undertake effective self-study both in the College and at home.

Bringing your own device with you will also provide you with unlimited access to MyNESCol, the College's virtual learning environment. MyNESCol provides a host of useful information about student life and makes it possible to access learning materials and tools on most internet enabled devices from any location. We have charging points around our campuses for you to use.

MyNESCol contains all the vital information about your course and allows you to communicate with lecturers and other learners. You can access MyNESCol even when you are not in College so you can easily catch-up or revise materials covered in class.

Through MyNESCol you will be able to access interactive materials, stream videos & podcasts, and access other resources such as:

- **Course announcements**
- **Course handbooks**
- **Lecture notes and handouts**
- **PowerPoint presentations**
- **Tests and quizzes**
- **Virtual classrooms**
- **Online resources**
- **Blogs & Wikis**

You may already own or have access to a laptop or similar device, however if you need to purchase a device before the start of your course a suggested specification is outlined later in this document. Please remember, for most courses, at least Microsoft Windows 10/11 Notebook or Laptop is the most appropriate device.

If you are on a non advanced course and require support to pay for a device, we may be able to provide you with a contribution towards the cost. This contribution is only available to students who apply for and are entitled to a college bursary. It is very important that you apply for your bursary as soon as you receive the application link via email and you must also complete the survey which is part of your enrolment. The survey can only be completed once and should you require a contribution towards your device you must inform us in your survey responses.

If you are on an advanced course (HNC or HND) you can apply for a student loan from SAAS if eligible, to fund the cost of purchasing a device. Successful applicants should apply for their loan from Student Award Agency Scotland (SAAS) www.saas.gov.uk as soon as you can to ensure that you receive your first payment as early as possible in the new term (you will not receive any loan payment until at least the first day of the course). Should anyone experience financial hardship then there may be help available via the College's Student Advice Centre teams. We may have a supply of loan laptops which you can apply for.

NOTEBOOK / LAPTOP SPECIFICATION

The following Notebook/Laptop specification is recommended as a minimum:

Operating System:	Windows 10/11
Processor:	Absolute minimum – 1.6 (GHz) equivalent or faster
Memory:	Minimum - 4GB RAM
Storage:	Minimum - 128GB with 4GB of available disk space (free 1Tb Office 365 OneDrive cloud storage is available to all students)
Display:	Minimum 11" screen (1280 x 768)
Wireless:	Networking - 802.11b/g/n (1x1)
Connectivity:	USB / Bluetooth
Additional:	Camera / Microphone
Battery Life:	5+ hours

DEVICE INFORMATION

During your course you will be required to undertake a large variety of tasks with your device including information searching, collaborative group work and using Microsoft 365 software applications.

For this reason a Windows-based Notebook or Laptop is the most suitable device to use. An Apple laptop is also suitable but not necessary for any course and you may find that the OSX operating system is not fully compatible with all applications available to you.

A tablet e.g. an iPad, Chromebook or mobile phone is not an acceptable device for a BYOD course since you cannot install the Microsoft 365 software locally on a Chromebook or a tablet/smartphone.

It is not necessary for you to purchase an expensive or high-end device for the purposes of BYOD and a minimum device specification can be found above. Suitable machines can be purchased from approximately £250 at most major retailers.

Once enrolled at College you will have access to a Microsoft 365 account. Not only does this give you access to your college email account but it also provides you with 1TB of cloud storage and access to the full suite of Office Microsoft 365 applications including Word, Excel, PowerPoint and MS Teams for the duration of your course. This means that you do not need to purchase the Microsoft Office 365 software if you do not already have it, or purchase a device with a large hard drive, enabling you to purchase a cheaper device if you wish.

Students who are required to undertake taught core IT units (such as ECDL or PC Passport) are advised to source a Windows-based Notebook or Laptop.

When you arrive at College a full induction will take place that will include the use of your computer, connection to the wireless network, access to and use of College resources and systems. In addition you will also be introduced to the excellent IT support services that you will be provided with whilst studying at College.
