Complemented by music rehearsal rooms, sound production suites, and TV and radio studios, this is where talent thrives and futures are shaped.



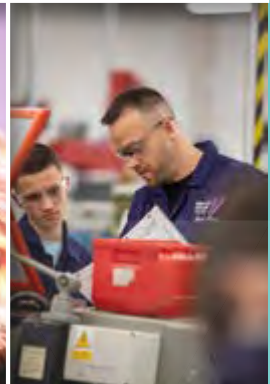
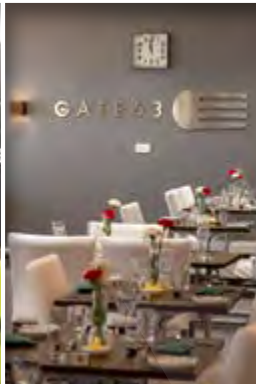

This new £10million facility opened in the summer of 2025 and is driving the region's journey to net zero. The Energy Transition Skills Hub was founded by ETZ Ltd, Shell UK and NESCol with support from the Scottish Government's Just Transition Fund and UK Government funding. The largest of its kind in Scotland, the facility expands the Aberdeen Altens Campus and provides industry-leading workshops and flexible teaching spaces, cutting-edge equipment and expert-led learning and training, ensuring students are equipped with the knowledge, technical capability and experience needed for energy transition.



Energy on the Move

As part of the Energy Transition Skills Hub project, our Energy on the Move vehicle is journeying across the North East of Scotland, providing inspiration for the energy transition. Housing the 'Net Zero Challenge', the vehicle expands into a classroom, providing a unique learning experience for school pupils and other community groups.

With an Academic Tutor assigned to every full-time student, there's a friendly face from day one to guide you during your time with us.

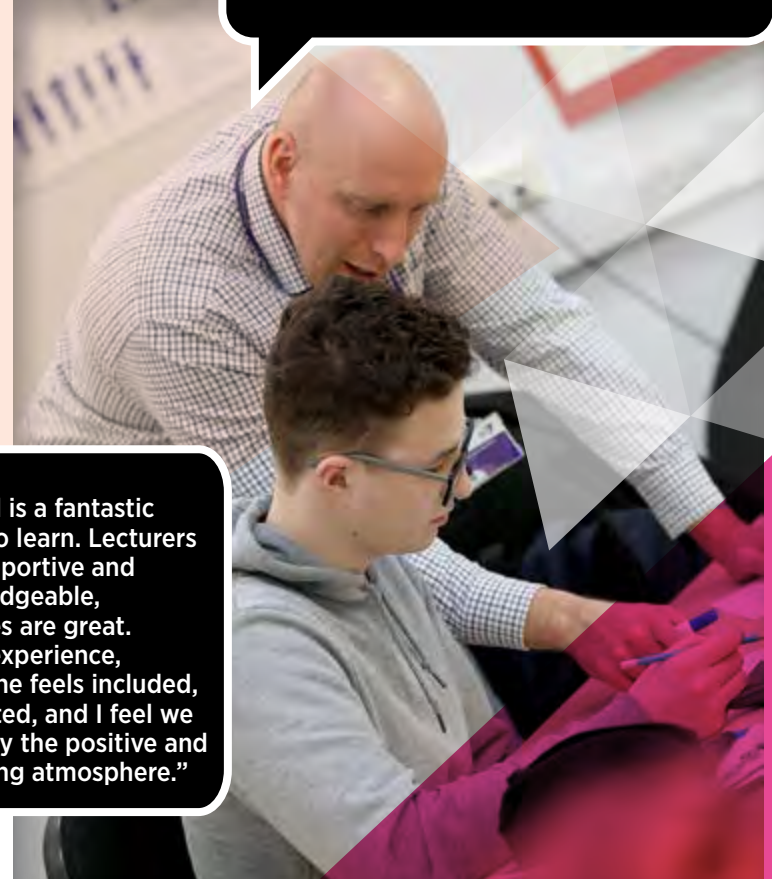

Freshers' Week

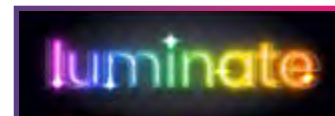

Each year, around 6,000 students join our full-time courses.

In total, we support more than 20,000 learners at any given time through part-time study, online and distance learning, school-college partnerships, and our role within the apprenticeship network.

Support Networks and Events

Support is at the heart of our student-centred approach. We offer a wide range of initiatives, including tailored support for care-experienced students and student carers. Practical advice is available to all students through sessions such as 'Hack Your Studies'. Students can also benefit from university transition workshops, career events, and free access to wellbeing resources and advice via Spectrum.Life, a platform offering 24/7 online mental health support.

Modern Apprenticeships

A Modern Apprenticeship provides anyone aged 16 or over with the opportunity to gain industry-recognised qualifications while working. Apprenticeships come in many forms and typically last between two and four years. To enrol, individuals must be employed.

pathways to university

Achievements at NESCol lay the foundations for exciting futures. For many students, that next step is university – and we make the transition seamless.

Each year, hundreds of NESCol graduates progress to degree-level study, supported by strong articulation agreements with RGU, the University of Aberdeen, and institutions across Scotland. These pathways allow students completing an HNC or HND to enter directly into year two or three of a degree course. In fact, a recent study found that over 55% of Scottish college leavers with qualifications at SCQF Level 7 or above continue their studies at university. With more than 50 established links to RGU alone, NESCol ensures your journey from college to university is smooth and successful.

NESCol and RGU have joined forces to make the journey from college to university as smooth as possible.

Through the Degree Link programme, students can begin their studies in NESCol's supportive environment and progress to university when ready. This pathway offers clear routes: completing an HNC typically leads to entry into year two of a degree, while an HND can open the door to year three. Some courses may have specific requirements, such as selected options, a portfolio, or an interview with an RGU tutor.

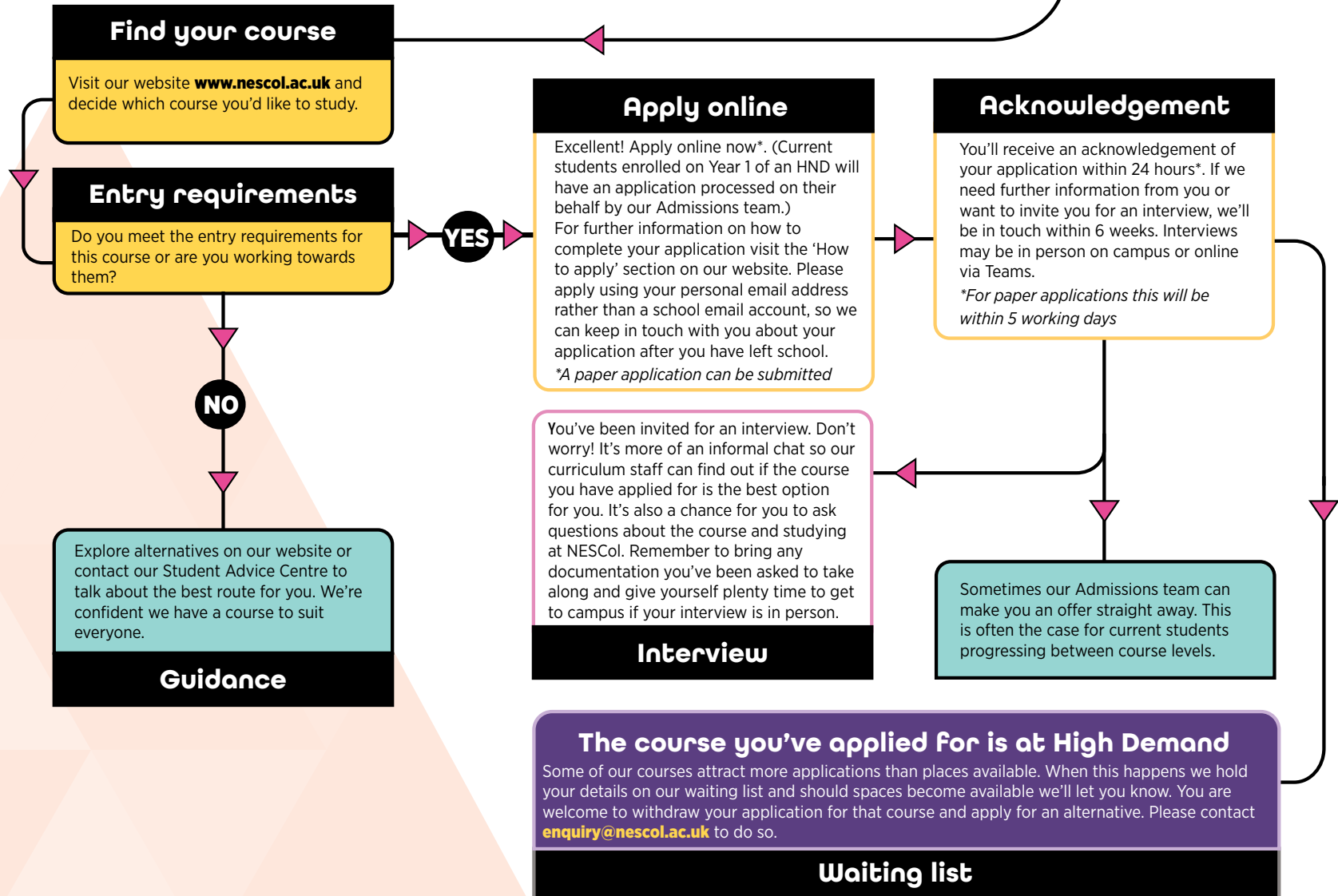

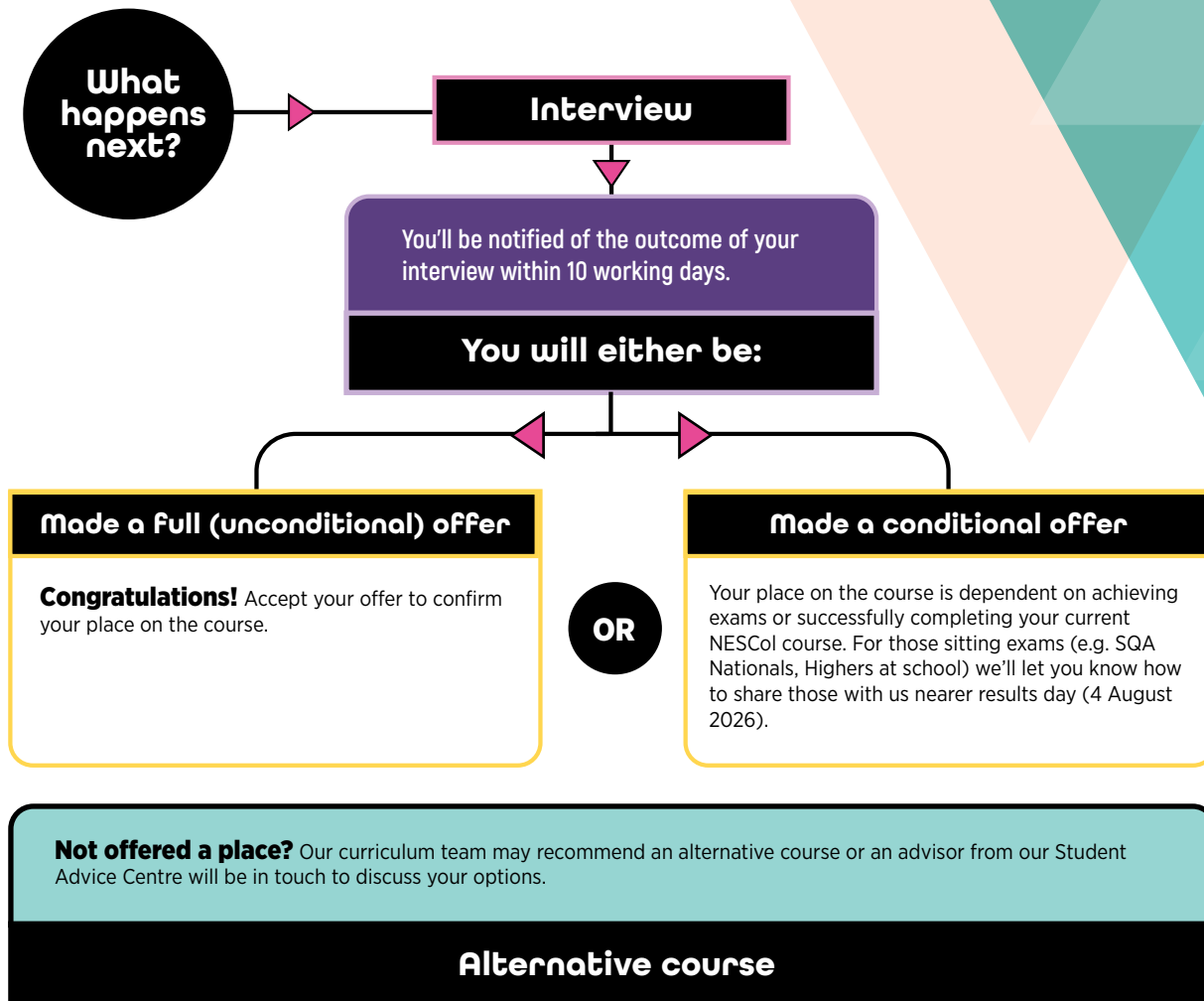

Access to Nursing (SWAP)**

Choosing the right course starts with understanding what's needed.

At NESCol, entry requirements are clearly outlined alongside each course description to help you make an informed decision. Where Highers are listed, this refers to SQA Higher awards at any grade from A to D.

Returning to education? Don't worry – if you don't have the listed qualifications, we also consider life and work experience. Examples could include paid employment, voluntary work, or caring responsibilities. Other activities that demonstrate your skills and enthusiasm will be taken into account. We accept equivalent qualifications too, including those awarded before National 4s, National 5s, and Highers were introduced, as well as qualifications from England, Wales, Northern Ireland, Ireland, and beyond.
