A new Aberdeen community venue for your group

The Energy Transition Skills Hub opened in the summer of 2025 and is already at the heart of the region's journey to net zero.

ETZ Ltd worked with partners to deliver the facility, which is operated by North East Scotland College. It received funding support from the UK Government and Scottish Government's Just Transition Fund for the North East and Moray, ETZ, Shell UK, Adura and NESCol.

The new facility, the largest of its kind in Scotland, is located adjacent to the College's existing Aberdeen Altens Campus and within the Skills Campus of the Energy Transition Zone.

The Hub provides:

- Industry-leading workshops and flexible teaching spaces, shaped by the needs of employers;
- Cutting-edge equipment reflecting to the latest advancements in the energy sector and showcasing future technologies related to the likes of offshore wind, electric vehicles, hydrogen fuel, and carbon capture and storage;
- Expert-led learning and training, ensuring students are equipped with the knowledge, technical capability and experience integral to energy transition;
- Accessible training designed to suit the needs of individuals and employers, blending provision for full-time students with opportunities for upskilling and reskilling through part-time, evening and weekend programmes;
- Community spaces for use by local groups and organisations, supporting the ambitions for a just transition for the North East.

Community space

The Energy Transition Skills Hub features a range of flexible areas perfect for community groups looking for a new and exciting venue for one-off or regular meetings and events.

From the exhibition space, accommodating up to 30 people and equipped with a large display screen, to an atrium café, large outdoor areas and tailored workshop opportunities – we're here to support your group's requirements
