## FORMAT AND RULES

## U16 BOYS CUP

- Three pools of three or four teams each.
- Teams plays each other once within their pool, with points being awarded as follows:
- Win: 3 points
- Draw: 1 point
- Loss: 0 points
- Teams will play home or away as determined by the competition fixture list.
- All matches must be played on the dates listed on the fixture list unless both teams agree to play on a different date.
- If a team is unable to play on the set date and their opposition are unable/unwilling to play on an alternative date, their opposition will be awarded a $5-0$ win and 3 points.
- In the event of a match being cancelled due to weather the Competitions \& Events Manager will determine the revised date for the fixture.
- All matches must be played by 3 December 2023.
- Matches should be four quarters of 15 minutes with a 2-minute break between quarters and a 5-minute half-time break.
- All matches will be 11-a-side and played on a full pitch using FIH rules.
- Running penalties will not be used in the pool matches - only in finals.
- Please refer to the Competition Rules issued to each participating Club and available on the Scottish Hockey website, under Competitions - Youth Hockey.
- Teams do not have to complete a Match Report Form for pool matches.
- Both teams should email the result to the Competitions mailbox at Scottish Hockey: competitions@scottish-hockey.org.uk within 24 hours of the match ending.


## QUALIFICATION

- At the end of the pool matches, the positions will be determined using the criteria in the competition rules (below).
- Four teams will qualify for the cup finals on Sunday 21 April 2024 at Glasgow National Hockey Centre: The top team in each pool and the best placed runner-up (one team).
- The best placed runner-up will be determined using the criteria in competition rules (below). Only the results between the top three teams in each pool will be used to determine the best-placed runner-up. The results involving the fourth-placed team in Pools A \& C will not be counted when determining the best-placed runner-up.


## CRITERIA - TIE BREAK POINTS (BASED ON FIH RULES)

In each pool, teams will be ranked according to the number of points each has accumulated in the competition.
a. If at the end of the pool matches two or more teams have the same number of points for any place in a pool, these teams will be ranked according to their respective number of matches won.
b. If there remains equality among two or more teams, then these teams will be ranked according to their respective goal difference (which means "goals for" less "goals against"). A positive goal difference always takes precedence over a negative one.
c. If there still remains equality among two or more teams, then these teams will be ranked according to their respective number of "goals for"".
d. Should there still remain equality among two teams, then the result of the match played between those teams will determine the ranking of the tied teams.
e. If more than two teams have the same number of points, then the teams involved shall be ranked according to Articles $a, b, c, \& d$ above. If there remains equality, then a ranking based upon the results of the matches among (only) them shall determine their respective positions.
f. If there still remains equality among two or more teams, the Competitions \& Events Manager will arrange a match between the teams involved to determine the final positions.
