Scottish Hockey is the national governing body for hockey in Scotland, supporting the sport from grassroots to elite performance.

This is an exciting opportunity to coach within the National Pathway, working with talented athletes and an experienced support team. The programme culminates in the Summer 8 Nations for the Emerging groups and U18 EuroHockey Championships for the Aspiring groups, where our aim is to be highly competitive in Europe. The role is central to strengthening player technical skills and preparing athletes for international hockey.

This is not a full-time role, and time commitments will vary.

The schedule includes single day training sessions and multiday camps. The National squads consist of players up to 19 years old, from which the Emerging and and Aspiring teams will be selected. This is an exciting opportunity to work alongside the Pathway Lead Coaches, Junior and Senior National coaches and a talented support team, helping develop Scotland's next generation of international hockey players.

Key Responsibilities

- Support the technical and tactical delivery of a National Pathway squad, ensuring a high-performance coaching environment.
- Assist in coaching sessions, match preparation, and player development in alignment with Scottish Hockey's talent framework.
- Work closely with the Lead Coach and multidisciplinary team, fostering a professional and supportive environment.
- Help identify and monitor high-potential players through observation days and competitions.
- Contribute to a culture of excellence by mentoring players, setting high standards, and encouraging continuous development.
- Support the integration of the pathway squads, with the SDP, senior squads and competitive international opportunities.
- Ensure compliance with Scottish Hockey's policies, including safeguarding, code of conduct, and athlete welfare.
