## GENERAL SPOT CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS

- Remove spillages promptly with an absorbent dry cloth.
- For best results always act quickly to remove stains.
- Do not use an abrasive pad, abrasive cloth or abrasive cleaning agent when sponge cleaning or treating stains.
- Do not use optical brightening agents, pure soaps, hypochlorite or bleach.
- Always first test any cleaning product by applying it in a hidden or an inconspicuous area.
- Loosen any solidified stains first by lightly beating and vacuuming.
- Using a lukewarm damp cloth or sponge gently work the stain from the edges, slowly moving in towards the centre of the stain, do not rub aggressively at the stain.
- If further cleaning is required, use a mild, non-biological, colour protecting liquid soap or detergent, again gently work the stain from the edges, slowly moving in towards the centre of the stain, do not rub aggressively at the stain.
- Dry the area with a clean, dry, lint free cloth after cleaning then repeat process with water only to ensure any residual cleaning product is removed.
